As noted in the past two Parish E-mails, a decision was made to keep open the **Early Childhood Center** until the end of the School Year in June as opposed to curtailing operations at the end of January. All the parents have been asked to contribute \$1100 per student to offset the projected deficit in the Center's budget. It was suggested that \$600 be paid on or before Monday January 4<sup>th</sup> with the remaining \$500 to be paid on or before Monday, March 1<sup>st</sup>.

**When you come to Mass, please observe *Social Distancing* and you must wear a mask.** The mask may only be removed when you are placing the Eucharist in your mouth and *not when you actually receive the Body of Christ from the Minister*. Please keep proper social distance when processing up the Center Aisle and returning by way of the Side Aisles.

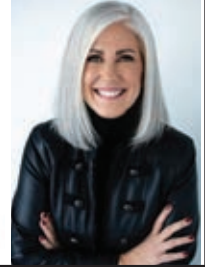
