Pentecost Sunday

TODAY'S MESSAGE

The Greek word for Pentecost (Pentekoste) means "fiftieth" and in early Christianity it referred to the entire Fifty Days of Easter. The roots of Pentecost can be found in the Jewish Festival of Weeks, the 50-day celebration following Passover. It is this festival that was being observed when the disciples came out of the upper room speaking in tongues, yet able to be understood by all. It's the reason so many "devout Jews from every nation under heaven" happened to be staying in Jerusalem in the first place. Traditionally, this event is considered as being a "reversal" of the confusion of tongues that occurred with the building of the Tower of Babel. (Genesis 11: 1-9) In fact, this story is one of the Scripture readings provided for the Vigil Mass of Pentecost. With the gift of the Spirit at Pentecost, people's ability to communicate with one another was once again possible!

This weekend, the beautiful Pentecost Sequence will be proclaimed at Mass with music and gestures. What is a "Sequence?" A Sequence is a piece of liturgical poetry that is read or sung as part of the Liturgy of the Word at Mass on some feast days. A Sequence expands on and explains the meaning of the celebration. During the Middle Ages myriads of Sequences were added to the liturgy.

Here is a list of the Sequences with their Latin names. (Among composers and musicians, the Latin names are probably better recognized than the English titles.)

- Easter: "Victimae Paschali Laudes"
- Pentecost: "Veni Sancte Spiritus" (not to be confused with the chant, "Veni Creator Spiritus", which is equally beloved)
- The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ: ("Corpus Christi") "Lauda Sion" (This is an extremely long Sequence and optional. This being so, even when it is used, usually only the very famous middle section is heard: "Ecce Panis Angelorum.")
- Our Lady of Sorrows (September 15): "Stabat Mater Dolorosa"

Monday, May 27th Pastoral Center Closed. Daily Mass schedule remains unchanged.


FEAST OF CORPUS CHRISTI

Fruits of the Holy Spirit



You may have received as you came into church today a little white paper dove with the name of one of the FRUITS of the Holy Spirit, or a little red flame with one of the GIFTS of the Spirit on it.

The dove is a reminder of what St.Paul says about the spiritual fruits, "If we live by the Spirit let us also be guided by the Spirit". He says each day that the Spirit of Jesus truly lives in our hearts we are being transformed, resulting in manifesting what Paul calls THE FRUITS - LOVE, JOY, PEACE, PATIENCE, KINDNESS, GOODNESS, FAITHFULNESS, GENTLENESS AND SELF-CONTROL. The flames are symbols of the GIFTS of the Spirit--WISDOM, INSIGHT, KNOWLEDGE, COUNSEL, FORTITUDE, PIETY AND FEAR OF THE LORD. The seven gifts are among the chief expressions of the Spirit's presence, activity and power.

The scriptural source for the GIFTS is found in the writings of the Prophet Isaiah II:I-5. All seven GIFTS of the Holy Spirit are the Baptismal heritage of all Christians. We are called as Christians to acknowledge them and reflect on them. Place your dove or flame where you will see it during the coming year-to remind you to pray that God will increase the FRUITS and GIFTS within you.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL COLLECTION — NEXT SUNDAY


