TODAY'S MESSAGE

Another successful school year has come and gone and many of our children are now attending Seton Summer School.

We have made many school improvements during that include: the construction of our Pre-K and Kindergarten buildings; installation of LCD monitors in each classroom; and the addition of a Public Address System throughout the school building and outside. In the next month, the school's exterior and interior doors will be replaced, and a buzzer/video system will be installed at the front door for added security.

The Pre-K & Kindergarten building project is close to completion, and we will begin our new Pre-K program for four-year-olds on August 21st, the first day of school. The Pre-K class is full, with thirty children.

The faculty has been fortunate this past quarter to participate in technology in-services through a partnership we have created with Foothill College. This professional development is possible due to the generosity of one of our donors, and will continue through the next 3 quarters of the next school year.

Eleven of the Seton graduates from the Class of 2013 will be attending the following Catholic high schools in the fall: Sacred Heart in Atherton, St. Francis, Notre Dame in Belmont, and Woodside Priory. One graduate will be entering the Blessed Jose Sanchez Del Rio High School Seminary in Mankato, Minnesota.

St. Elizabeth Seton School is grateful to Fr. Matt and the parish staff as well as the many parishioners who continue to support our mission of providing a Catholic education for our children.

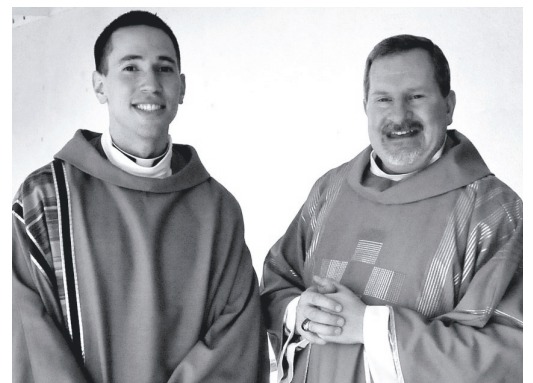

The Summer Camp at beautiful Hidden Villa Ranch on Moody Rd. in Los Altos Hills will be providing scholarships for 69 children from East Palo Alto and East Menlo Park this summer. For the last 25 years, the St. Vincent de Paul Society at St Francis Church in East Palo Alto has helped over 1500 children take advantage of these scholarships.

Twenty seven of the children, the younger ones ages 6 to 9, can get the fun and education of going to summer camp on a working ranch where working with farm animals is part of the camp experience. But these campers need to be driven back and forth four times a week. They stay overnight on Thursday night, where they sleep under the stars and see deer wandering in their campground when they wake up.

This is a very needed experience for children who, in these days, live cooped up in their crowded homes due to their parents fear of gang violence on their streets and parks.

Can you offer to provide this transportation to three children in either the morning or evening for one week (or more). The average distance is 12 miles one way and the average driving time is 25 minutes. The arrival is before 9am and the departure is at 4pm except for an 11:45am departure on Friday. The camp starts on June 17 and ends Aug 23
