3rd Sunday of Easter **April 10, 2016**

From the Desk of Deacon Chris.... TAKE THE LEAP

St. Mary's School in Waterford recently had a Learning Fair, and invited parents of students to visit the school to view their children's classroom work. My wife was asked to attend, and I offered to take her, and pick her up so she would not have to drive at night. The evening was scheduled to end at 7:30 pm, and I got back to the school around 7:00 pm. I parked in the parking lot across the street from the school, and just observed people going about their business. My attention settled on three children, two boys who seemed to be about the same age, and a younger little girl.

If you are familiar with St. Mary's, you know there is a wall that runs up the hill parallel to the school. The two boys spent the entire time I waited running up and down the hill with the great happiness of being outside on a nice spring evening. The little girl was kind of just dancing around at the bottom of the hill. The mothers of these children were maybe 15 steps away visiting with one another.

The little girl eventually got around to the wall. At first, she just stood on one side and peered over to the other side, since the wall was not very high at the bottom. Slowly, she stepped up on the wall, and just stood there for about a minute. Finally, the little girl took a leap from the wall to the ground. She landed on both feet, and lightly fell back on her behind. Guess what she did next? She got right up and did it again, and again, and again. Gradually the little girl went a little higher up the wall each time she jumped. Sometimes she landed cleanly, sometimes she fell forward on her hands, or back on her behind, but every time she got up and went higher. Finally, after many leaps, the little girl reached the top of the wall and made her ultimate jump. From the car, I could almost sense her sense of great achievement.

You might be wondering why I mention this. Well, it seems to me that the little girl's adventure might resemble a person's attempts at evangelization. I bring this up during this Easter Season because we read from the Acts of the Apostles during Easter. We hear the stories of the early Church, and the efforts of St. Peter, St. Paul, and the other apostles as they spread the Word of God to everyone they met.

Now you might think you do not know enough to evangelize, or you might be afraid of failure or ridicule. So I say to you what Jesus so often said, "Do not be afraid." Learn from the little girl who started out at the bottom of the wall, and gradually reached the top. Take little steps, and you might just find yourself going higher and higher just like the little girl. After all, what is there to be afraid of? Jesus is right there with you all of the time! So go ahead; take the leap, take the leap of faith! You can do it! God bless.

Health Tips: Vitamin D to the Rescuel As we emerge from darker winter days and get outdoors, exposure to sunlight spurs the body to make vitamin D – it's called the "sunshine vitamin" for good reason! But not everyone produces enough. In fact, in the U.S. and Europe, it's estimated that nearly two-thirds of adults are deficient in the vitamin. Having enough vitamin D is crucial for good health, since it plays a part in bone and heart health, protects against certain cancers, diabetes, and age-related macular degeneration, and can help combat depression. To get your daily dose of D, make sure your diet consists of these foods: salmon and trout, canned tuna and sardines, fortified beverages (including low-fat milk, soy milk or almond milk) and cereals. If your diet doesn't consist of foods high in vitamin D, consider a supplement, but don't overdo it: Aim for 1,000 IV of vitamin D a day.
