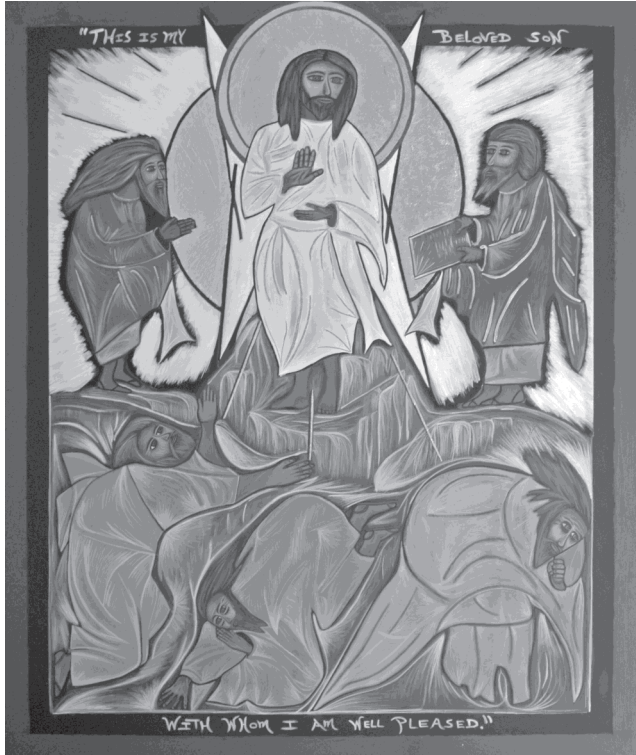


Transfiguration Parish

From the Desk of Deacon Chris...
THE BREAD OF LIFE, AND THE CUP OF ETERNAL SALVATION

Last Sunday, Transfiguration Parish celebrated the First Holy Communion Mass in Schaghticoke for nineteen of our children, and their families and friends. The church was full for the Noon Mass, and there were multiple flashes from cameras as the children processed in at the start of the Mass. I'd like to share some observations that I came away with.

The children were wonderful. They were very excited, but they did an excellent job paying attention during the Mass. When they came up around the altar for the Eucharistic Prayer, they focused on what Father Ingemie was praying, and they joined in with clapping their hands and singing. They answered the prayers out loud just like the adults in the congregation. They made me very proud.

During Holy Communion, I could not help but notice that the children were very focused on receiving the body and blood of Jesus for the very first time. I know they practiced because we practiced at rehearsal the Friday night before, but there was a noticeable difference when they received the living body and blood of Christ. They looked me in the eye, and responded, "Amen" very clearly when I offered them, "The Body of Christ." There was no question in my mind that the children were very aware that this was a very important moment in their lives. My hope and prayer is that they will always have that reverence in the moment, and the realization that they are receiving Jesus himself whenever they receive holy communion throughout their lives.

Again, this year, I am so very pleased with how much the children know about our faith, and their love of Jesus. I extend my grateful thanks to their faith formation teachers. In fact, I want to thank all our faith formation teachers at every grade level. I am always impressed by what our children and youth know about our faith. Our faith formation teachers truly understand what stewardship is by giving their time and talent to educate our youth, which is one of the most important things we do. I would be remiss if I did not thank Beth Thayer for everything she does as our Director of Religious Education.

Two more observations in general. First, I know there were quite a few people from our parish who attended the First Communion Mass who had no family relation to a child. They came because they are from Transfiguration Parish, and they wanted to support the children! Isn't that wonderful? Second, I experienced something I can only describe as an, "AHA" moment during distribution of communion. A young girl came before me to receive holy communion. I offered her, "The Body of Christ" and she responded, "Amen." Then she looked me in the eye, and whispered, "Thank you." She did not have to say thank you, but it struck me as a beautiful testimony that she is thankful for the gift of Jesus in holy communion. It was a special moment for me.

Receiving the Bread of Life and the Cup of Eternal Salvation is always cause for rejoicing! God Bless.

Blood Pressure Screening THIS weekend. Stop in and have your blood pressure checked and your blood sugar read by a Registered Nurse.

***Health Tips:** Get fruity! A couple of servings a day may help you to keep macular degeneration away. If your brain, heart and eyes met for lunch, they'd probably order the same thing. The legendary benefits of the plant-rich Mediterranean diet don't end with your brain or your ticker — your whole body benefits, including your eyes. New research shows that including plenty of fruit in that Mediterranean diet may cut your risk of the leading cause of age-related blindness by a third. Holy papaya! Colorful, delicious fruit is loaded with antioxidants that are important for eye health, like vitamins A and C. Put berries, melon, kiwi, citrus, mango and other colorful fruits on your weekly shopping list, and have a couple of servings a day. Make sure you're eating a rainbow of veggies too (think sweet potatoes, carrots, squash, broccoli and spinach, with some garlic and spices to make it taste joyful). Add leafy greens like kale and collards and you'll get an array of vitamins and phytonutrients that benefit your eyesight. Seafood is an essential part of the Mediterranean diet too. The omega-3 fatty acid DHA (found in wild salmon), in particular, may support eye health. And don't forget the extra-virgin olive oil. A "fruit-forward" Mediterranean menu is not only delicious, it may keep you singing "I can see clearly now..." well into your twilight years.*

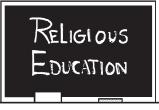
