*From the Desk of Deacon Chris...***THE ALPHA AND THE OMEGA**

On the last Sunday of the liturgical year, the Church celebrated the Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. In the second reading from the Book of Revelation, we hear the Lord God say, "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the one who is and who was and who is to come, the almighty."

Jesus is the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. Alpha and Omega are the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet, and we are reminded that Jesus is the Alpha and the Omega every year during the Easter Vigil as the paschal candle is inscribed with the same Greek letters, the Alpha and the Omega.

As we begin the holy season of Advent, it is good to remind ourselves that Jesus is the King of the Universe during this season of joyful, prayerful preparation for Christmas as we reflect on Jesus who is, who was, and who is to come. Truly, our Lord Jesus is with us at the beginning of our lives, at the end of our lives, and every single moment in between. Just thinking and reflecting on that is cause for great joy in our lives.

When will Jesus come again in glory? This question has occupied people ever since Jesus rose from the dead, and ascended into heaven. People have spent hours upon hours studying the stars, or whatever else they deemed necessary, to predict the second coming of Christ. During this Advent season, I suggest we should focus more on being ready for Jesus when he comes again. Perhaps we can all place the spirituality of Christmas ahead of the commercialism of Christmas. We do not know when Jesus will come again, but we can all prepare ourselves for the second coming, so when Jesus comes again in glory, we will be ready to greet him.

Saturday, December 8 is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, which is a Holy Day of Obligation. We will honor our Blessed Mother Mary who was conceived without sin. Mary always leads us to her son, Our Lord Jesus, who is the Alpha and the Omega.

Advent is a season of anticipatory joy, a season of "The already but the not yet," as we rejoice that the kingdom is already in our midst while being aware that the kingdom has not yet arrived in its fullness. I wish everyone a prayerful, joyful Advent. God bless.


