

St. Francis Summer Camp FAQ'S

What are the prices?

\$1700.00 for all 8 weeks

\$50.00 per day

\$220.00 per week

½ day option except for Thursdays-\$30.00 (there is no age minimum)

What are the times for ½ days?

8:30-12:00 without lunch

12:00-3:30 with lunch

Does the camp have a hot lunch program?

No, the camp does not offer a hot lunch program. Children bring lunches from home that are refrigerated.

Is there an aftercare program?

Yes, our aftercare program runs from 3:30-6:00 for an additional charge of \$18.00 *per day per family*.

Is there a before care program?

Yes, our before care program begins at 7:30-8:30 for an additional charge of \$5.00 *per day per family*. If you arrive to camp BEFORE 8:30 a.m., you will be charged for before care.

Are there any dietary restrictions?

Yes, we are a peanut and tree nut free school. All food that is brought into camp must be tree nut and peanut free.

What is needed for a peanut allergy?

Any camper who requires the use of an epi-pen and/or inhaler **MUST** fill out the action plan form that is on our website and it **MUST** be signed by your doctor. Any medication that needs to be dispensed must be current and up to date.

How do you transport the children?

We use Dapper Bus Company for trips and for pool days.

Can we switch or make up days?

No, you are not able to switch or make up days due to staffing reasons. Please see me if there is a circumstance that you need to discuss with me.

When does camp begin?

Camp begins June 22 -August 14.

What are the camp hours for a regular camp day?

The camp runs from 8:30-3:30. Before **Care is from 7:30-8:30 and after care begins at 3:30-6:00 p.m.**

Will children be able to be grouped with siblings?

Due to the activities that are planned and the crafts, children are grouped according to age. However, all campers eat together and see each other frequently during the day.
