“Having come down in a cloud, the Lord stood with Moses there and proclaimed his name, ‘Lord.’ Thus the Lord passed before him and cried out, ‘The Lord, the Lord, a merciful and gracious God, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity.’ Moses then bowed down to the ground in worship. Then he said, ‘If I find favor with you O Lord, do come along in our company.

Reflection from Sr. Anita
Trinity Sunday- My Beloved

This Sunday is Trinity Sunday, a celebration of one of the greatest mysteries of the Church. We celebrate the great **LOVE** between the Creator, God the Father and the Redeemer, God the Son which gives us the Spirit of Love, the Sanctifier, God the Holy Spirit.

The Trinity was present at the Baptism of Jesus in the Jordan River. At the moment of Jesus' Baptism, the Holy Spirit descended on Jesus and God the father proclaimed, **this is my BELOVED SON in whom I am well pleased.**

The word **BELOVED** has such deep meaning and brings to mind the thought of someone dearly loved. I think of young couples and some not so young whose devotion to each other is still vibrant. I also think of parents' love toward their children. The deep commitment and dedication they have through life's challenges.

Imagine being beloved of the Father. Yet at every baptism, God the Father says that about the child or the adult who is baptized. To be God's beloved and to receive the permanent mark of belonging to Christ. There is no better gift to a child just beginning their life journey.
