



2020 Summer Camp Information – Adjustments to Camp Procedures

We are so excited to see everyone soon! Camp will open on June 1, 2020. While you will see many familiar faces (not really, because all staff will wear masks), you will notice several adjustments to our policies and procedures. We have been reviewing the requirements and guidelines provided by the state of Louisiana, local civil authorities, and the Archdiocese in order to ensure that camp will operate both according to current allowances and in a way that will keep our campers healthy and safe.

*Due to gathering restrictions, we will not have a “meet and greet” before the beginning of camp and we will not have end of camp performances. We will send out Google Forms to you for ordering camp t-shirts and for establishing prepaid food accounts.

*To limit exposure, parents will not be allowed on campus. Your camper will be dropped off and picked up at their assigned gate. Different gates are used for different age groups- you will be notified of your gate number in a separate email. If you have more than one camper, your older camper will be dropped off and picked up at the same gate as your younger camper.

*Drop off will begin at 7:00 AM each day. At 9:00 AM, all gates will be closed. Campers who arrive after 9:00 AM should be brought to gate 4.

*Gates will open for dismissal at 3:00 PM. At 3:20, all gates will be closed. Parents who arrive to pick up campers after 3:20 should report to gate 4 to pick up. Aftercare charges will not be incurred until 3:30.

*Aftercare campers will be picked up at gate 4. You will be asked your camper’s name and your camper will be brought to gate 4 for you to sign them out.

*Upon arrival, each camper will have their temperature taken and will use hand sanitizer. These entry procedures are mandatory for all campers. We will have several stations to accommodate these tasks. All camp staff will also have temperatures checked daily.

*If your child has a fever of 100.4, you will have to return to pick them up immediately. Your camper will not be allowed to return to camp until he/she is fever free. In the interests of health and safety, please do not send your child to camp if he/she is showing any signs or symptoms of any illness.

*While all camp staff are required to wear facemasks, facemasks are optional for campers.

*Campers and staff will be required to sanitize hands at least every two hours, as well as before and after certain activities.

*Cleaning and disinfecting procedures for camp spaces provided by the state and CDC will be implemented and strictly adhered to.

*To limit exposure, no field trips will be taken. However, campers entering kindergarten and older will be allowed to swim at Capitano’s Tennis and Athletic Club. Campers will be transported in school buses. Social distancing at the pool and on the bus will be implemented.
