Dear parishioners,

There are several things to pay attention to in the readings today. First is how much God loves his people and goes out of his way to protect and guide them: The people are the vineyard. The vineyard owner picked a fertile spot, cleared it, spaded it, planted the choicest vines, built a watchtower.... In the gospel the vineyard owner put a hedge around it. (I'm sure you have heard someone say, "You're a garden with a fence around it." to let another know he/she is very special.) So the first thing we are to learn from the readings is that God holds his people very near.

Secondly, God thinks about the whole Israelite nation. Richard Rohr said in his presentation that individualism is the worst heresy. We have made religion into a meand-God relationship, and God is interested in all the people and deals with them as a people. We need to develop that same kind of interdependent attitude. I need to be my brother's/sister's keeper. I need to acknowledge my need for others and all of creation.

Thirdly, we are responsible for the quality of our lives. Punishment is not something God does in a vacuum. We set the stage for punishment ourselves. Parents know that. Children will say their parents are mean. They are rather training their children to choose good. St. Paul tells us how to live a life of quality. He tells us to focus on what is true, honorable, just, pure, lovely, gracious, excellent, and praiseworthy. Focus on doing good!

Let's try to work on those things.

#### "Voices of Experience" Death Penalty Panel

October is Respect Life month. As Catholics, we are called to respect life from the moment of conception to natural death. Come and learn about the use of the death penalty in Ohio when First Mennonite Church hosts "Voices of Experience," a town hall panel discussion on Tuesday, October 14, 2014, from 7 pm to 9 pm at the church. Speakers include Derrick Jamison, who was exonerated and freed after being on death row for almost 20 years; Terry J. Collins, who oversaw more than 30 executions as Director of the Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction; Charles Keith, who has both lost a loved one to murder and whose brother was on Ohio's death row before his sentence was commuted: and a member of the Ohio Supreme Court Joint Task Force to Review the Administration of Ohio's Death Penalty. The event is open to the public. (St. Mary's is co-sponsoring by hosting the clergy luncheon here at noon. This will be one of our 150 acts of service.)

Father DeChant was a Redemptorist priest who travelled through this area to minister to the Catholics living in this area. James and Sarah Owens offered him hospitality. The Owens sons would run through the neighborhood when Father DeChant was here to gather people for Mass. Father DeChant continued the instruction of the Owens family that Bishop Purcell's debates had begun. The Owens family--James, Sarah and nine children were baptized by Father DeChant in 1859.
