Dear parishioners,

Did you ever wonder what prompted Jesus to ask the question: "Who do people say I am?" Was he wondering if he was being successful in making God the Father known? Was he discouraged and wondering if he was doing anything to make a difference? Was he testing the apostles to see if they were getting the message?

The apostles have obviously been listening to people. They have answers. Elijah. John the Baptist. Then Jesus wants to know who they say he is. Peter gets it right, "The Christ of God." The word Christ means "the anointed one." Peter has come to realize that Jesus is extraordinary. Jesus is the one sent by God. After the resurrection the apostles will realize that Jesus IS God.

The first reading gives us an insight into what it means for Jesus to be God. The people of Israel will be aware of offending God and they will mourn over their sins as a parent mourns the death of a child. That's mighty powerful! How many of us have that kind of sorrow for disobeying God's commands? Is it because we don't realize who we are in the light of God's holiness and greatness?

And the people will know "a fountain to purify from sin and uncleanness." The very God whom we offend offers us ungrudging forgiveness.

The second reading tells us that in God's eyes we are all brothers and sisters—ALL of us. Perhaps if we really understood this there would be no Orlando massacres. Who is God? Who am I? These are great questions to answer sincerely from our hearts.
