Dear parishioners,

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday. It is a devotion credited to Sister Faustina Kowalska who had visions of Jesus telling her of his unfathomable mercy. Pope Saint John Paul II established the devotion for the universal Church.

This day, however is about much more than this devotion. We have just finished a year of reflection on and witness of God's mercy. Pope Francis tells us that the name of God IS mercy. The Pastoral Council this year read together the book The Name of God Is Mercy. At times we found Pope Francis' description of mercy hard to fathom. Our culture is much more interested in justice. Yet God is both—all-merciful and all-just. He is willing to forgive all while still holding us accountable.

As I was thinking of this, it occurred to me that the basis of understanding and experiencing mercy is responsibility. It is not uncommon these days to find something broken or missing without explanation. Many live the motto: "If nobody finds out, I'm not guilty." This certainly does not build character, and it certainly does not open us to mercy.

How much better to take the thing that is broken to the person to whom it belongs, tell what happened, say I am sorry, and offer to replace it (make amends). Now there is endless room for mercy and justice. I am accountable, I can be forgiven, I may or may not be required to make amends, but I have a clear conscience and great relief.

It's the same with God! Let's open ourselves to God's unfathomable mercy by being accountable.
