Third Sunday of Lent March 4, 2018

Dear parishioners,

It seems to me the readings today challenge me to authenticity. How thoroughly real and sincere is my commitment to God?

The first reading lays out the ten commandments—the minimum that is required of us to be a disciple. These are the directives God put forth for his people in the very beginning of their relationship. They are the start of the Israelites growing to know and serve the one God.

St. Paul reminds us that following Jesus will involve the cross. Human nature fights against that reality. "Christ crucified is a stumbling block to the Jews and foolishness to Gentiles." We'd rather have power and superiority conquer evil. We don't want pain and weakness to be the victor. This is an invitation to be co-redeemers with Jesus and to follow his way. "For the foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength."

In the gospel we witness Jesus' wrath that the money changers are using the guise of worship and sacrifice in the temple as a cover for their greed and scheming. How real and sincere is their prayer and worship? Jesus reminds them and us that his house is a house of prayer. Do I come to Mass to authentically pray and worship or am I on "automatic pilot" to fulfill an obligation and avoid feeling guilty?

We have a lot of soul searching to do.
