Dear parishioners,

If you have the opportunity, read some of the Book of Ezekiel the prophet. He has some very strong language for Israel.

What struck me in the first reading is how surely God is leading Ezekiel in his ministry as prophet. God tells him "I will set you on your feet." God will decide when it's time to speak. When it was not time to speak, Ezekiel could not speak. He was dumb. And God says to him in this commissioning scene—Oh! Not to worry. The folks are going to know there is a prophet in their midst! Stay tuned!

That line scared me a little. I also want to be God's instrument. But I know how folks get treated when they say things nobody wants to hear.

Jesus knew that too, and in our gospel for today Jesus was a little scared I believe. He had astonished the hometown folks with his knowledge and his authority. One would think that was a good thing. The response however is to reject Jesus. "A prophet is not without honor except in his home town." They don't want to hear from Jesus. They've known him since he was a kid. They don't want to let him be anybody but who they want him to be.

It's a good time to remember two things: 1) being a disciple is not about glory or convenience or accommodation. If I am at God's service, I am attentive to how and when God needs me. 2) Let people shine. We all grow and change. I have to keep my ears open for truth—not just what I want to hear so I'm not challenged.
