Feast of the Epiphany January 6, 2019



Dear parishioners,

In some cultures this day is the day when gift exchange happens. This allows families to give their full focus to Jesus on his birthday—the mystery of the Incarnation. Some parents give their children only three gifts for Christmas because that's how many Jesus got. I like both those traditions. They bring faith into lived experience.

We have attached a lot of meanings to this feast. It is the day we celebrate that Jesus was revealed, not only to the Jews, but to all nations. It's the feast when we reflect on the meaning of the three gifts brought by the Magi. They reveal who Jesus is: gold (He is king.), frankincense (He is God.), and myrrh (He will suffer greatly.)

We meditate on the faith and the trust of the Magi. How would you follow a star? Why would you follow a star for such great distance? You would need to be motivated by something very important. These Wise Men knew this star they had studied was marking something very significant—the place where God came to earth!

I even heard one person say these men were wise because they knew how to change their plans! They were not so dyed-in-the-wool sure of what they wanted to do that they could not follow the direction of the angel who told them to go home by another way.

Whatever this feast has to teach us, I hope we learn it well. Happy Little Christmas!
