Enrollment for 2021-22

We will begin the enrollment process for the 2021-22 school year when current families receive Letters of Intent to Enroll in the Friday folders next week, Jan. 15. At that time we will provide information on tuition and fees. Families who return the letters and registration fees by Feb. 5 will receive a tuition discount of \$50 per student and will be guaranteed a spot in each child's class.

To maintain our small class sizes, our policy is to cap enrollment in grades 1-8 at 15 students, and in kindergarten at 12. We had to close enrollment in kindergarten this year, and we expect next year's 1st grade class to be full. We also expect to have 10 students or more in several other grades.

Current families with children who will be enrolling in pre-K or kindergarten are asked to let me know, just so we have an idea of what to expect.

We will have another Open House for prospective families during Catholic Schools Week on Wednesday, Feb. 3, 12-2 pm.
