LK 19:1-10

At that time, Jesus came to Jericho and intended to pass through the town. Now a man there named Zacchaeus, who was a chief tax collector and also a wealthy man, was seeking to see who Jesus was; but he could not see him because of the crowd, for he was short in stature. So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree in order to see Jesus, who was about to pass that way. When he reached the place, Jesus looked up and said, "Zacchaeus, come down quickly, for today I must stay at your house."

And he came down quickly and received him with joy. When they all saw this, they began to grumble, saying, "He has gone to stay at the house of a sinner."

But Zacchaeus stood there and said to the Lord, "Behold, half of my possessions, Lord, I shall give to the poor, and if I have extorted anything from anyone I shall repay it four times over." And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house because this man too is a descendant of Abraham. For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost."

Entonces corrió y se subió a un árbol para verlo cuando pasara por ahí. Al llegar a ese lugar, Jesús levantó los ojos y le dijo: "Zaqueo, bájate pronto, porque hoy tengo que hospedarme en tu casa".

Él bajó enseguida y lo recibió muy contento. Al ver esto, comenzaron todos a murmurar diciendo: "Ha entrado a hospedarse en casa de un pecador".

Zaqueo, poniéndose de pie, dijo a Jesús: "Mira, Señor, voy a dar a los pobres la mitad de mis bienes, y si he defraudado a alguien, le restituiré cuatro veces más". Jesús le dijo: "Hoy ha llegado la salvación a esta casa, porque también él es hijo de Abraham, y el Hijo del hombre ha venido a buscar y a salvar lo que se había perdido".

Pastor's Corner

This is something that I printed in the bulletin a number of months ago. After including this more recently in a homily, a number of you asked me for this list again, so I decided to print it again. It comes from St. JoseMaria Escriva, the founder of Opus Dei. I thought the list would be useful for us to more deeply examine our lives. For my part I can count at least 9 or 10 of which I am not innocent.

17 Signs of a Lack of Humility according to St. JoseMaria Escriva:

1. Thinking that what you do or say is better than what others do or say.
2. Always wanting to get your own way.
3. Arguing when you are not right or--when you are--insisting stubbornly or with bad manners.
4. Giving your own opinion without being asked for it, when charity does not demand that you do so.
5. Despising or looking down on the point of view of others.
6. Not being aware that all the gifts and qualities you have are on loan (from God).
7. Not acknowledging that you are unworthy of all honor or esteem, even the ground you are treading on or the things you own.
8. Mentioning yourself as an example in conversation.
9. Speaking badly about yourself, so that people may form a good opinion of you, or to elicit praise from them.
10. Making excuses when rebuked.
11. Hiding some humiliating faults from your spiritual director or confessor, so that he may not lose the good opinion he may have of you.
12. Hearing praise with satisfaction, or being overly glad that others have spoken well of you.
13. Being hurt that others are held in greater esteem than you.
14. Refusing to carry out menial tasks.
15. Seeking or wanting to be singled out for praise
16. Letting drop words of self praise in conversation, or words that might show your honesty, your wit or skill, or your professional prestige.
17. Being ashamed of not having certain possessions.

Esta lista de 17 cosas es algo de que prediqué una vez hace unas meses y algunos de ustedes me pidieron que yo imprimara otra vez. Es algo que encontré acerca de probar nuestra humildad (o falta de ella). Nos viene de San JoseMaria Escriva, el fundador del Opus Dei. Pensé que sería útil para nosotros para examinar nuestras vidas más profundamente. Por mi parte, puedo contar nueve o diez de que no soy inocente.

17 Signos de una falta de humildad según San JoséMaria Escriva.

1. Pensar que lo que haces o dices es mejor que lo que hacen o dicen lo demás.
2. Siempre querer hacer lo que te guste.
3. Discutir cuando no tienes razón o, cuando tienes razón, insistir obstinadamente o con malas modales.
4. Dar tu opinión sin ser pedido, cuando la caridad no te lo exige.
5. Despreciar el punta de vista de lo demás.
6. No darte cuenta que todos los dones y cualidades que tienes son prestados.
7. No admitir que no estas digno de todo honor o estima.
8. Mencionar a sí mismo como ejemplo en conversación.
9. Hablar mal de sí mismo, para que otros piensen cosas buenas de tí, o te contradigan y hablen bien de tí.
10. Poner peros cuando eres corregido.
11. Esconder faltas humillantes a su director espiritual o confesor, para que no pierda la buena opinión que tiene de tí.
12. Oír alabanza con satisfacción, o estar contento que otros han hablado cosas buenas de tí.
13. Ser lastimado porque otros son mantenidos en alta estima más que tí.
14. Rechazar a hacer tarea menial.
15. Buscar o querer ser alabado.
16. Diciendo palabras de auto-alabanza en conversación, o palabras que muestren tu honestidad, tu ingenio o habilidad, o tu prestigio.
17. Tener vergüenza de no tener ciertas cosas.
