A Message from Fr. Matt ...


Dear Brothers and Sisters,

So how are you doing? Someone told me that this is the weirdest time that they have ever lived through. That is pretty spot on. There are many things we count on in troubled times that aren't there for us. I think you know what I mean..State Stores! Honestly, think about the things we do regularly: go to work or school, get together with family and friends, go to Mass, go shopping, hug each other. These are simple things we can't do right now. It is tough. Some people are really afraid, and have good reason to feel that way. Some are annoyed at the disruption to our lives, and they have good reason, too. It is just weird. It seems like everything is stacked against us. Is this a moment to despair? I think it depends on how you see it.

How you see it? That is pretty much the theme of the Readings this week. In the First Reading, God chooses one of Jesse's sons to be King. But it isn't the son who Jesse thought would be picked. His older sons were more accomplished, polished, and seemingly ready, but those men weren't God's choice. God takes David, the youngest of Jesse's sons. It is confusing to all of them. Why David? Because "not as man sees does God see, because man sees the appearance, but the Lord looks into the heart." God sees things differently than we do. How do you think God is seeing this week?

Do you feel like God is crossing His arms and saying, "Let's just see how they do without me!" Or maybe you feel like the restrictions about attending Mass and participating in group gatherings will anger God because we are depriving people of Him when we need Him the most. If we feel either of these, we are not seeing as God sees.

The Pharisees in today's Gospel are so caught up, as they normally are, on following the Law that they miss the saving power of God that is present before them in Jesus. We can be so like the Pharisees! They totally miss the fact that the Law is God's gift to them. They don't get that the Law can be a vehicle to God, a way to encounter Him, but the Law is not God. We see ourselves deprived of Mass, of Stations, of regular confession times (of fish fries!) and we say that we are being kept away from God at a time when we need Him most. But that is not true. Just as the Pharisees tried to use the Law to limit God, when we see the current boundaries as keeping us from God, we are limiting God! These things, like going to Mass, praying Stations, they are vehicles to God, but they are not God. Yes, the Eucharist is God, but the Eucharist is here! He sits in the tabernacle of each church. And we must not limit Him. The Second Reading says, "Awake, oh sleeper!" God is not standing with arms folded. God is not angered that we are deprived of public church events. God is here. He is mercy itself and He wants to give you everything that you need.



So, how do we learn to see things the way God sees? In the Gospel, the man born blind is a great example for us. Jesus sees this man, not as his neighbors see him, a sinner, a person lacking, but as God sees him. Jesus looks at the man's heart and has mercy. The blind man knows of Jesus only because of what others have told him. But he isn't satisfied with that. When he is face to face with Jesus, he tells Him, "I believe in You." The man has no regard for what others have said or what the Law says. I believe in you, he tells Jesus. The one who was blind all his life was able to see much more than those with eyesight. Jesus knew that was in his heart.

Last week we talked about hope, about faith in God unlocking power. We talked about quenching the thirst of Jesus by believing in Him. The eyes of faith are the eyes of God. Through the eyes of faith, how do you view what's going on in our lives right now? We see people hurting, people afraid, people annoyed. But God sees into the heart. What do you see in the hearts of people? I have seen fear and I have seen frustration, but I have also seen so much love, so much concern for others. So much good.

We have an opportunity in these weird times to challenge the limits we put on God. God is not closed up in a building. He is here. He is with us. Faith in this, and in Him, gives us eyes to see things clearly. This is a weird time, but it could very well be the best time. A time to challenge our relationship with God. To see if we have, in fact, enshrined vehicles to God as gods themselves. Do we have the eyes of Pharisees or the eyes of the healed blind man? Take a step. Trust in God. Believe and watch that belief open up eyes that see as God sees.
