As of June 14, the Vermont Department of Health announced that there are no longer any state Covid-19 restrictions or requirements for Vermonters or visitors to follow. Since vaccination rates in Vermont are at 80% and Covid-19 cases are low, churches may remove all Covid restrictions and return to the regular celebration of Mass and all other pre-pandemic parish activities.
