NOTES FROM FR. TIM

Lessened sanitizing requirements in parishes: The state of Vermont has made recent relaxations in mandates for COVID spread precautions. The main protocols in place for Catholic parishes are remaining for the present time, with this one exception: the disinfecting of pews after Masses with sanitizing solutions is no longer required of parishes. This is due to abundant evidence that risk of contagion through surface contact has been determined to be very low. Our spray bottles and paper towels for sanitizing will be removed from the church windowsills, but a small supply will be left at the entrance by the hand sanitizer and extra masks, where any attendees may make their own "sanitizing wipe" to take on their way to the pews if they wish.

Easter Holy Water Bottles: Holy Water bottles are available in the church for anyone's home and uses of private devotion. You may also refill your own holy water bottles brought from home.

Dedication of the Statue of Our Lady: Our May 1st outdoor Mass program will start with a Rosary at 9:10am. Mass will be offered at 9:30am, and then a May crowning of the new statue will proceed. Bring your own camping chair or folding chair. Plans are in the works to include a memorial of

Deacon Joe Lane at this time, thinking of his recent passing.

May 1st and 2nd Food Drive: Our May 1st and 2nd Food Drive is getting an extra push. Bishop Coyne has asked all parishes to make an effort for food shelf donations on this weekend, observing the Memorial of St. Joseph the Worker (May 1st), and using the project title "St. Joseph the Provider." As normal, this and all our monthly food shelf collections are donated to the South Burlington Food Shelf. The outdoor Mass and May Crowning is another opportunity to bring food shelf donations over this weekend.
