Dear Parishioners,

*This is our first weekend back to Mass, even though at a limited 25% capacity (36 for MHNJ and 65 for BSC), and the Church will be open a 1/2 hour before Mass. Different instructions will be given throughout Mass, and at this time I'm asking all those entering the Church to please wear a mask. Let us remember the words of Jesus, our savior, "When two or more are gathered in my name, there I am in the midst of them" (Mat 18:20). Even though Christ is with us always by His Spirit dwelling in our souls, there is something so profound and personally moving about the experience of being united in worship and praise at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.*

*This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, that foundational truth and mystery of our faith that God, although one, is three persons. This mystery opens us for so much pondering and prayer because we must remember that it is in the image and likeness of the Trinity that we are created. Within the life of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is eternal self-giving love, a love that is dynamic, creative, and generative – and that God has revealed His innermost secret: that not only is He an eternal exchange of love – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit – but that he has destined us to share in that exchange.*

*How beautiful and meaningful – that the God who created you, sustains your very being by His love, is the same God who desires you to share intimately in His eternal life, His eternal goodness, His eternal beauty. If that isn't the most affirming reality that our faith teaches us...then I don't know what is! There is no greater life that exists in us then, through baptism, the life of the Trinity. There is no greater power that exists than the love that IS GOD, which holds all things in being. We are blessed beyond imagination.*

*As we come back together to begin life post-pandemic, I pray that this week you take some time to ponder this mystery of the Holy Trinity. Consider their perfect, selfless love – how free they are in their gift of self, and ponder what that means in how you've been created. May the Trinity awaken in your soul the 'more with God' that you have been created for!*

*On a side note...some folks have been wondering about first Holy Communion, and those who have been preparing for the Sacraments of Initiation for RCIA – and a decision will be made in the next two weeks and we'll let you know how we plan to celebrate this special moment of grace in the lives of our children. Let us continue to pray for each and for our world, that together we may grow in mercy, patience, and forgiveness towards one another. God bless you and have a grace-filled week!*

## PRAYER TO THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

**I**t is with an abundance of joy and gratitude that I announce the first phase of the reopening of our churches to celebrate daily and Sunday Mass beginning June 1. The obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains lifted until further notice, especially if you are part of a vulnerable population and/or have an underlying health condition.

Please approach the celebration of Mass with charity and love for our clergy and faith community by following the protocols:

- ◆ Stay home if you are sick or not feeling well.
- ◆ Wear a mask in Mass.
- ◆ Sanitize your hands upon entry. Due to shortages of sanitizer, please bring your own if possible.
- ◆ Sit in designated pews and respect social distance between others of 6 feet or more unless you are one family unit.
- ◆ Refrain from congregating in tight areas or entering cordoned off areas.
- ◆ Follow the protocols to receive Holy Communion as directed at Mass.
- ◆ Follow your church protocols regarding registration if necessary due to the 25% capacity limit.
