Dear parishioners,

As May draws to a close and our devotions to Mary conclude, my hope is that those who attended were uplifted in their faith, and tasted a bit of the sweetness of her love, her joy, and her peace. BUT THERE'S MORE!! There is always more with God. If you're ready to take the next step in your faith journey, then please consider joining myself and other parishioners in making a Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary!

Total Consecration to Jesus is a powerful exercise to deepen your spirituality and ability to serve Jesus. St. Louis Marie de Montfort simply taught that Jesus came into the world through Mary, and to imitate God, we ought to go through Mary to grow closer to Him. We consecrate ourselves in order to be more devoted to the Lord and His Blessed Mother. It helps us grow in holiness and increase our faith, hope, and love. This prayerful and focused method will draw you closer to Jesus than ever before.

Why consecration? And why consecration through Mary? What does that even mean? Consecration means to set aside for a sacred purpose. Mary's life was set aside for the sole purpose of serving God. She teaches us how we too can completely give ourselves totally to Jesus in a fundamental way that consecrates us to Him. Because she loves God perfectly, Mary shows us how we can love God more and how the whole of our lives can become an offering to Him. St. John Paul II's love for Mary was profoundly shaped by this Consecration to Jesus through Mary according to the method of St. Louis de Montfort and led him to take it as his papal motto: *Totus Tuus, Maria* – "Totally Yours, Mary."

How does it work? Two generous parishioners have paid for 75 books that are available on a first come, first serve basis. The book has a simple, clearly outlined program for daily prayer for 33 days – the 34th day is consecration day and always falls on a Marian Feast day. The 33 day preparation period is done individually, but the consecration will be done together. The start date is July 20, and the consecration date is Sunday, August 22 – The Feast of the Coronation of Mary as Queen of Heaven and Earth. I hope you will join us and take our Blessed Mother Mary more deeply into your heart, that she may share with you the beauty and riches of the divine life of her son.

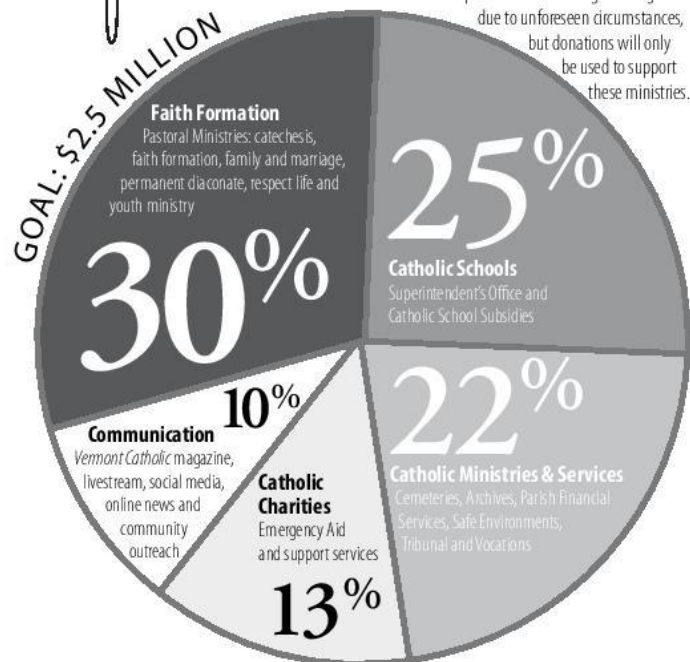

BISHOP'S ANNUAL APPEAL 2021

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, Pope Francis has designated this year “The Year of St. Joseph,” drawing our attention to St. Joseph as a model for discipleship. St. Joseph has many titles — St. Joseph the foster father of Jesus, the worker, the dreamer — but the title that resonates most with me is St. Joseph the doer. Whenever he heard the call of God and his faith was challenged to do something that seemed difficult, he responded with a “yes.” When he was concerned about taking Mary as his wife, he was told in a dream to do so, and he did. When he was told to flee to Egypt with Mary and Jesus to protect them, he did so. When he was told to return to Nazareth, he did so. Most importantly, he willingly embraced the role of foster father to the Son of God without hesitation. St. Joseph was a man of faith ready to do the will of God no matter the sacrifice.

I see that same commitment to do the will of God in our own Diocese. I have been your bishop for more than five years, and during this time we have accomplished a lot. We carried out a synod in which we came up with three key priorities on which to focus our ministerial work:

- ✦ **Evangelization** — welcome people back to the Church.
- ✦ **Vibrant Parishes** — engage parishioners in the community life of the parish and leadership opportunities.
- ✦ **Communication** — expand communication efforts.

Following the synod, we redirected Bishop’s Annual Appeal resources to focus on these key priorities. In doing so, we improved our communication infrastructure and created new faith formation opportunities so when the pandemic closed our parishes and schools, we were able to livestream almost 200 faith engagement activities, including daily and Sunday Mass; swiftly shift our schools to online learning; continue financial emergency aid to the needy — many impacted by Covid; and so much more.

As a Church, God has called us to spread the news that Jesus Christ is the Son of God and Savior no matter the challenges. Please help us continue to do God’s work by making a gift to the 2021 Bishop’s Annual Appeal.
