Dear parishioners,

For near 15 months, we have had restrictions for Mass because of COVID 19, and I am pleased to report that we are back to full operation in our parish. Once again the collection will be taken up by ushers, communion will be distributed as usual, and we can exchange the sign of peace per comfort level. Bishop Coyne has encouraged those who are not vaccinated or who may be in a higher risk category to wear a facial covering, but this is no longer mandated.

Fr. Joseph and I have commented to each other how wonderful it is to see your faces again, but we also recognize that we need your help to begin the work of rebuilding our parish family now. You may know of someone who hasn't been back to Mass for awhile, or perhaps gotten into the routine of participating in Mass online, and they may simply need a little encouragement or invitation from you to return to Mass with the community.

As we celebrate Corpus Christi this weekend, I invite to reflect on the meaning of the Eucharist in your life. Over this past year, we have taken all kinds of caution to 'be safe,' but I wonder if that idea of 'being safe' has become an idol in our culture. Certainly there is nothing wrong or sinful about protecting one's physical health and being cautious when there is legitimate danger. However, we need to remember where we've come from. As Catholics, we celebrate different martyrs and saints who died or risked their lives for the Eucharist. In places in our world today where Christians are persecuted and killed for their faith in Christ, they risk death every time they go to Mass

Padre Pio once said, "It is easier for the earth to exist without the sun than without the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass." If that's true, then we need to consider in our own personal faith, in our relationship with Christ, what the celebration of the Mass actually means. We've been hearing and saying, "Be safe," to others regarding the physical harm and even death that Covid 19 could bring if one contracted it. Yet consider how, "Being safe," may apply to the health of our soul.

As we honor the Most Precious Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ this weekend, (1) who will you reach out to invite to come back to Mass with you; and (2) do an evaluation on your spiritual health and ponder what coming to Mass to celebrate the Eucharist actually means to you. Have a blessed week!



Bishop to ordain a priest and a transitional deacon

wo men are scheduled to be ordained this year — one to the priesthood and one to the transitional diaconate.

Burlington Bishop Christopher Coyne will ordain Deacon Robert Murphy a priest and seminarian Gregory Caldwell a deacon preparing for priesthood at a special Mass on Saturday, June 19, at 10 a.m. at St. Joseph Cathedral in Burlington.

The bishop will place his hands on the head of the candidate for priestly ordination, and through this Laying of Hands and the Prayer of Ordination, the Gift of the Holy Spirit for the priestly office will be conferred on the candidate for priesthood who will receive the stole and chasuble, signs of the office of the ministerial priesthood.

Deacon Murphy graduated from Mount Anthony Union High School Bennington in 2013 then attended Providence College where he earned a bachelor's degree in philosophy in 2017.

He first felt the calling to the priesthood in elementary school. "I was open to the call and desired to do God's will for my life," he said. He chose to study for the Diocese of Burlington because it is his home Diocese, and he felt called to serve the people of Vermont.

"There have been many great priests in Vermont who have inspired me in my discernment of the priesthood," he said.

Caldwell, who graduated from Essex High School in 2008, earned a Master of Arts in Catholic philosophical studies from St. Meinrad Seminary in St. Meinrad, Indiana. He was received into full communion with the Church in 2013.

He has said he hopes to bring to the priesthood an ability to "teach in a way that can reach people," an ability to show people how to live their faith and the willingness to bring the sacraments to the people of the Diocese of Burlington.

Deacon Murphy advises men who are contemplating priest-hood to focus on growing in holiness — especially through daily prayer — and striving to grow in virtue. "I believe that if they are open and seeking to do God's will, God will lead them to their vocation and give them what they need to live it well," he said.

The ordination will be a special time for clergy to meet in a spirit of fraternity and camaraderie.

Due to the seating capacity restrictions, attendance at the Mass will be by invitation only to allow for the priests of the diocese, Robert and Greg's family and friends, and members of their home parishes to attend.
