Dear Parishioners,

What a blessed first week! At the Masses last weekend I met the folks at Most Holy Name of Jesus and this weekend I'm excited to meet the folks at Blessed Sacrament. In my prayer this week, the Lord has just overwhelmed me with gratitude and joy in this new beginning and I am eager to settle in and get to know each of you. Please be patient with me – I'm quite good with faces but it may take a little while before I get your names down.

By way of introduction as your new Pastor, my name is Fr. Jon Schnobrich (pronounced Shnow-brick), but in the parish I'll go by Fr. Jon. I grew up in a little farming town just north of Hartford, CT called East Windsor. When I was 8 years old, my dad took my 2 older sisters and I skiing, and *literally* it's been downhill ever since! I spent a lot of my boyhood in the Ludlow, VT area at our family camp and attended Castleton State University, where I minored in skiing and majored in soccer, but actually earned a degree in Secondary Education with a focus in Social Science.

After college I returned to CT for one year and taught at my old high school while coaching the Jr. High boy's soccer team and assisting as the High School girl's track & field coach. But something was missing – my heart was still in Vermont. At the end of 2000, I moved back to the Green Mountains and took a job as the academic coordinator for a homeless/runaway shelter for teenagers. During that time, God made it clear that He was calling me to be His priest.

I began seminary in 2001 at Mt. St. Mary's Seminary in Emmitsburg, MD, where over the next 6 years I would study, pray, form lifelong friendships, and finally be ordained a priest with my Vermont classmate, Fr. Dallas St. Peter, in June of 2007 for the Diocese of Burlington.

My first assignment was as parochial vicar at Corpus Christ Parish (St. Johnsbury, Danville, and Lyndonville). After 2 short, full years, Bishop Matano assigned me for the next 7 years as the Director of the Catholic Center at UVM and the Assistant Director of Vocations. Serving the college students was a blast, but I never went to sleep on the same day I woke up and learned that collegians are nocturnal creatures. When Bishop Coyne arrived, he assigned me as the full-time Director of Vocations for the Diocese, where for the last 3 years I've been caring for our seminarians in their formation and working with other men who are discerning a priestly vocation.

So strictly speaking I don't meet the requirements of being a "Vermonter," but I've always considered myself an 'adopted son.' I am grateful to God to be your pastor and I'm excited to get to know each of you and grow together in the life of grace. God bless you and have a great week!
