*Dear Parishioners,*

Let me begin by first thanking everyone who helped to organize the Masses where I was installed as Pastor last weekend. A special thank you to Deacon Tom Cooney and Phyllis Lepito for quarterbacking the efforts, as well as all of the staff, finance and parish council members who were able to be present, the servers, musicians, and lectors – to all who made it such a beautiful and powerful liturgy, and those who made the reception so warm and helped with the delicious food– thank you.

Last week, a parishioner clued me in that Fr. Joseph and I had made the local paper...online! A few Fridays ago, we made a pastoral visit to the Lamoille County Field Days, where I introduced Fr. As we had dinner together last Saturday after the Vigil Masses, we spoke about the blessing we both feel in being assigned to serve here in Lamoille County in such active communities.

This past Tuesday one of our own daughters of Vermont became a final professed Sister of Life at the Basilica of St. John the Evangelist in Stamford, CT. Sr. Josephine Rose of the heart of Jesus, along with 2 of her classmates, professed their final vows of poverty, chastity, obedience, and to protect the sanctity of human life.

Who are the Sisters of Life? They were founded by John Cardinal O'Connor 25 years ago to witness to and reverence the sanctity of human life. In his words, "The Sisters of Life exist to mother the mothers of the unborn, to mother the unborn; to mother all those who are frail, all those who are vulnerable, all those who are ill, all those who are in danger of being put to death, all those whose lives the world considers useless. Our Lord says to each Sister of Life, "Woman behold your son. Behold your daughter."

Sister Josephine Rose grew up in Milton, VT and attended St. Michael's College, and after college worked with the poor in Burlington as the director of St. Joseph's House, during which time she began mother intentionally discerning what God was asking of her. As His will became clear, she entered formation for the Sisters of Life and now will join their beautiful and much needed mission in witnessing to and protecting the sanctity of human life. I've known Sister as a close friend for 10 years, and to see her now as a fully professed Sister of Life, a Bride of Christ, was a joy that words cannot express.
