*Dear Parishioners,*

Continuing to build upon the theme of my previous message from 9/1 with a focus on families and bringing aspects of our celebration of the Eucharist at Church into the home, the “domestic Church,” let me offer another faith action.

In the past 7 weeks, I’ve celebrated 6 baptisms, and I have another 2-3 coming up in the next few weeks! New life is such a blessing – and the very first action during the rite of baptism is the tracing of the sign of the cross on the forehead of the person to be baptized, claiming them for Christ. THEN, the parent and Godparents imitate the action, imparting this blessing of their new baptismal identity: a beloved child of the Father. You may have noticed that those who bring forward the gifts of bread and wine during the Mass will receive that same blessing from me as I trace the cross on their forehead and bless them.

This action of blessing by tracing the cross on the forehead is always a reminder of our baptismal identity. In a culture that aggressively wants to impose some other identity upon us, as Catholics we are reminded each time we make the sign of the cross that the truth of our identity is a beloved son or a beloved daughter of the Father, bestowed upon us at Baptism, and it is an identity that can never be changed, erased, or undone. It reminds us of our great inheritance to share God’s life, and that we are counted among His chosen. The sign of the cross is also a weapon against the poisonous lies of Satan that attack our dignity and our identity in Christ.

One beautiful tradition of our faith is how that blessing would be brought into the home and shared among family members. By tracing the sign of the cross on the forehead daily (you can even use a little holy water... the kids love that!) and saying, “God bless you, my child, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit,” parents bless their children and renew their baptismal identity as God’s beloved child. If you live alone or your children are grown, it is a good practice to bless yourself with holy water and the sign of the cross at the beginning and end of the day.

As the school year has begun and the Catechetical year is about to, a reminder that there is a meeting for families desiring to have their children registered for Catechism Classes this year: 9/22 at 915am for Blessed Sacrament families, and 9/29 at 915am for Most Holy Name Parishioners. I look forward to seeing you there. God bless you!
