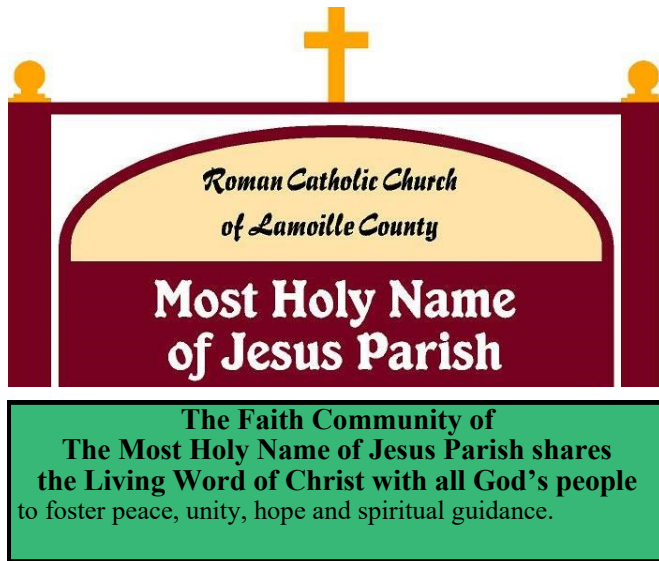

Dear Parishioners,

I remember being a young boy and my heart awakening to the sacred. Like so many of our early lessons in life, this experience took place in my home growing up. We had a pretty simple house with lots of room outside to play, a swing set, monkey bars, and fields to explore. But in our home, my folks had different symbols of our faith all around the house.

Next to photos of family and pictures of scenes from nature, Mom and dad had different images around the house that reminded us of the sacred. In their bedroom hung an image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. In our living room were little statues of the Blessed Mother and St. Therese. Next to the different posters of my favorite athletes in my room, and the different music bands my sisters were into at the time, there was a crucifix hanging on our bedroom wall. Inevitably my mom would leave prayer cards by the sink or in the bathroom to encourage us to aware of God's presence no matter what we were doing.

How blessed we are to have such beauty in our faith expressed by different artist that can be helpful reminders of Gods presence in our lives and in our homes! These expressions of our faith and devotion remind all who live in our home and visit it that it is a sacred place where God is loved and revered, and where the love of Christ is shared. One question I encourage you to discuss as a family is how does your home reflect the reality of being a "domestic Church?" Have a beautiful week and may God bless you!
