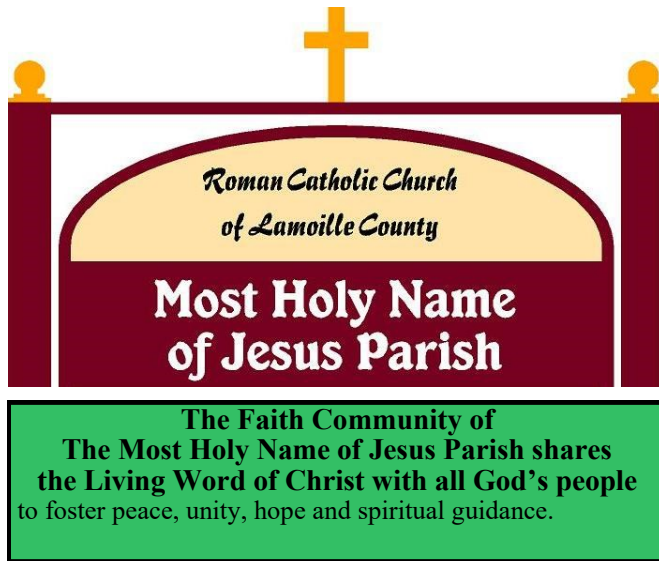

Dear Parishioners,
This week October begins and in the United States we begin Respect Life Month in the Catholic Church. Respect Life Month is dedicated by the USCCB (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops) to promote a “nationwide effort to help Catholics understand, value, and help cultivate respect for human life.” Why is this important for us as Catholics?


In the words of St. John Paul II, so that “together we may offer this world of ours new signs of hope and work to ensure that justice and solidarity will increase and that a new culture of life will be affirmed for the building of an authentic civilization of truth and love” (EV6). Before the issues of life are political, they are first *moral*. Jesus emphatically teaches that all life is sacred, particularly the most vulnerable, and that we have a moral responsibility to do all that we can to protect the sanctity of the gift of life from the womb to the tomb.

Everyday the news increasingly reveals the effects of the culture of death – most noticeably a de-sensitization toward the dignity and sanctity of human life. Our Catholic faith motivates us to not only be involved in defending life, but also deeply committed to helping those to find healing who have been affected by the evil of abortion, euthanasia, embryonic stem cell research, and all other attacks on the most vulnerable in our society.

“Christ Our Hope: In Every Season of Life” is the theme for Respect Life Month, and one that centers us on the reality of the Paschal Mystery. Like us, Christ entered the world through the womb of woman. He willingly experienced the fullness of human suffering. He breathed his last on the Cross at Calvary in order that He might save us. Therefore, ‘God is the foundation of hope: not any god, but the God who has a human face and who has loved us to the end’ (*Spe Salvi 31*)” (Reflection from respect-life.org).

May our seeing into the faces of one another remind us of the greatest miracle of God becoming human and making his face known, taking our humanity into Himself and revealing how much He loves every human life that He creates. God bless you and have a great week!
