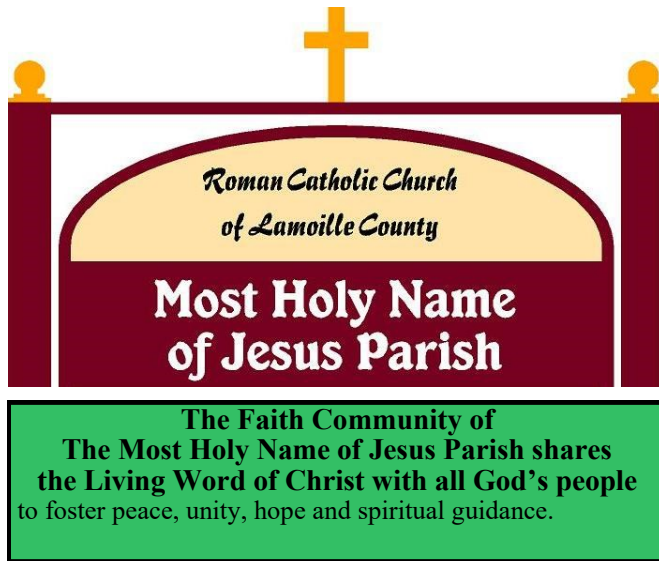

Preparation For Confirmation

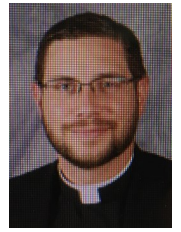

Dear Parishioners,



In his first letter to Timothy, St. Paul writes, “Have nothing to do with profane myths or old wives’ tales. Train yourself for the life of piety, for while physical training is to some extent valuable, the discipline of religion is incalculably more so, with its promise of life here and hereafter. You can depend on this as worthy of complete acceptance” (1 Tim 4). So how do we train ourselves and our children in the discipline of religion, and what does that mean in our day to day life?

The word ‘religion’ comes from a Latin word, *religare*, which means to bind. One may interpret this in a negative way, as a burden, but historically the intent is positive. Religion indicates relationship, meaning that the interior discipline St. Paul writes to Timothy about is actually meant to serve the relationship, *the bond*, between us and God. The stronger and more mature this bond becomes, the greater our experience of life here and hereafter.

Have you ever heard of the 5 Precepts of the Church? Maybe it’s been awhile – but check them out:

1. Attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor
2. Go to confession at least once a year.
3. Receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least once during the Easter season.
4. Observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church.
5. Help to provide for the needs of the Church.

Hence, these ‘rules’ of the Catholic Church are not intended to be a burden, but rather to help us cultivate the discipline of religion in our lives, that we may possess the promises of our Lord who came, “that we may have life, and have it in abundance” (Jn 10:10).

One daily way to grow in this discipline of religion is awareness. I remember learning to bless myself with the sign of the cross or pray a ‘Glory be’ whenever driving past a Catholic Church because the true presence of Christ in the Eucharist is there. Or to pray a ‘Hail Mary’ for the souls in purgatory whenever driving past a cemetery or when being passed by a police car, fire truck, or ambulance to pray for our service men and women and those they are attending to. In these and many others we can cultivate that awareness of God in our lives, and strengthen that bond of religion.
