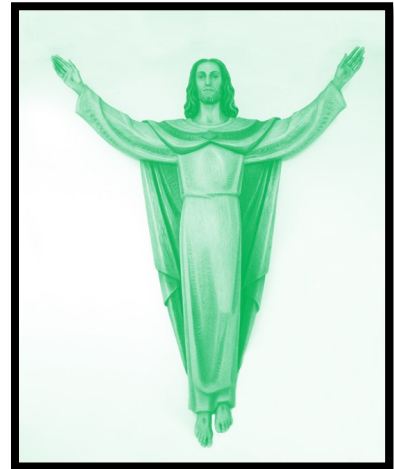
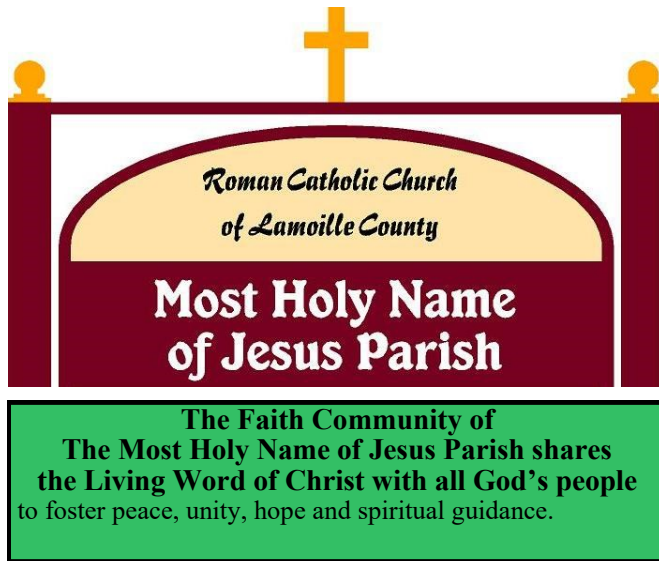

Dear Parishioners,

As a priest, one thing I enjoy is being asked ‘random questions.’ When I’m at dinner with some folks, a reception, in the grocery store, or wherever, after chatting for a bit and the casual part of the conversation concludes, I’m often asked, “Father, I have a random question for you.”

Most recently, I was asked the ‘random question:’ is it ok for a Catholic to receive communion at a Protestant service, like a funeral or wedding or a Sunday service. There is much confusion about this – but the clear answer is no...and here’s why. Catholicism has always held that the Eucharist NOT just a symbol or sign, but actually is the *body, blood, soul, and divinity of Jesus Christ*, and Christ gave the authority to His Church to actually confect the Eucharist.

Is it true that some Protestants believe that communion in their church is actually the true presence of Christ – yes. But their subjective belief doesn’t make it so. The legitimate authority, objectively given by Christ to his Apostles and passed onto their successors (the Bishops), and through the Bishops to their co-workers (Priests) – is the source of sacramental authority.

For a Catholic to receive Holy Communion at Mass is a huge deal. The word, “amen,” translates into, “yes, I believe.” That “AMEN” upon reception of the Eucharist is not just giving our assent to the belief that this is actually *the body, blood, soul, and divinity of Jesus Christ*, but is giving assent to the authority that comes from Christ to confect the Eucharist. That same authority that is exercised in the Church’s dogma and doctrinal teaching, even on the moral hot button issues. Our ‘amen’ is giving our “Yes, I believe and accept everything that the Catholic Church holds and teaches as true.” But why? Because Christ, the head, and His Church, the body, cannot be separated – they are one. Our ‘yes’ to Jesus is our ‘yes’ to His Church; and our ‘yes’ to His Church is our ‘yes’ to Jesus.


For a Catholic to receive communion in a protestant church is actually telling a lie. To receive communion is to demonstrate that one is in union with the authority from which that communion originates. One cannot be both in full communion with the Catholic Church and in full communion with a protestant church because the two do not hold the same things as true, nor is their authority equivalent. We certainly pray and work for unity among all Christian denominations, but to blur the lines of communion doesn’t progress any real unity – it simply ignores the reality of the differences.
