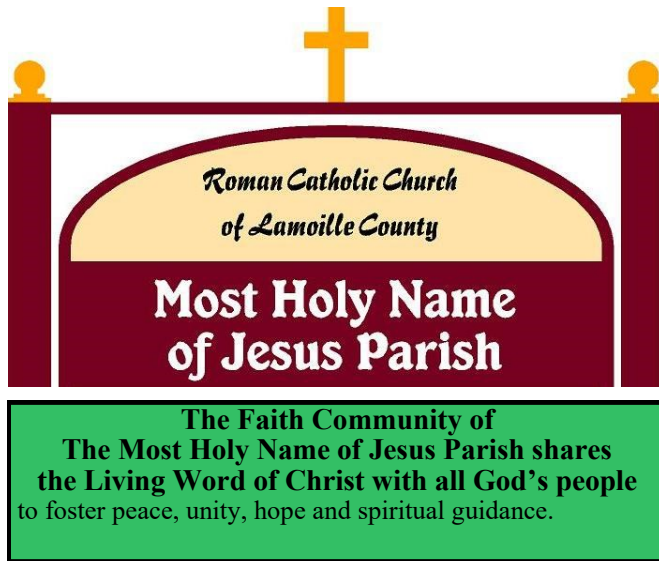

Dear Parishioners,
I love questions about God, the faith, and the Church. Jeremiah 17:10 says, "I, the Lord, search the heart and test the mind..." Catholicism has never been afraid of questions, but actually encourages them. God endowed us with an intellect that seeks reason and truth; we are hard-wired for understanding and knowledge. When I encounter a person sincerely questioning to learn or understand something about God, faith, or Church teaching, it is the Holy Spirit at work, drawing them deeper into the mystery of our faith and our call to union with God.


"So Father...I have a question. What does the Church think about evolution?" Well first of all – keep in mind that science and faith are not opposed to each other, regardless of what the culture says. Second, remember that the story of creation in Genesis is written with poetic language conveying theological truths and not as a science textbook. Finally, although evidence has been found to support evolution, it is a theory and not a law. So where does the Church stand?

The Church holds that the human person is not just a body, or just a soul, but is the composite of both body *and* soul. Concerning the evolution of the human person, Catholicism allows the possibility that the human body has evolved from previous physical forms under God's guidance. BUT, the Church insists that the creation of every soul is always an intended, willful act of God. In other words, our bodies may have evolved to their current form through a process of evolution guided by God, but the soul doesn't evolve – it's always created directly and immediately by God at the moment of conception.

So a person could be an evolutionary biologist while still being in line with what the Catholic Church teaches, provided they accept that the soul does not evolve as part of a God-guided process of biological evolution. Much to the chagrin of modernity, science and Catholicism are actually not opposed to each other, but rather both aim at the same end - truth. God bless you and have a great week!
