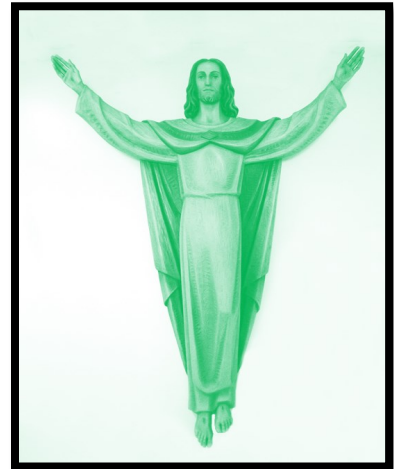
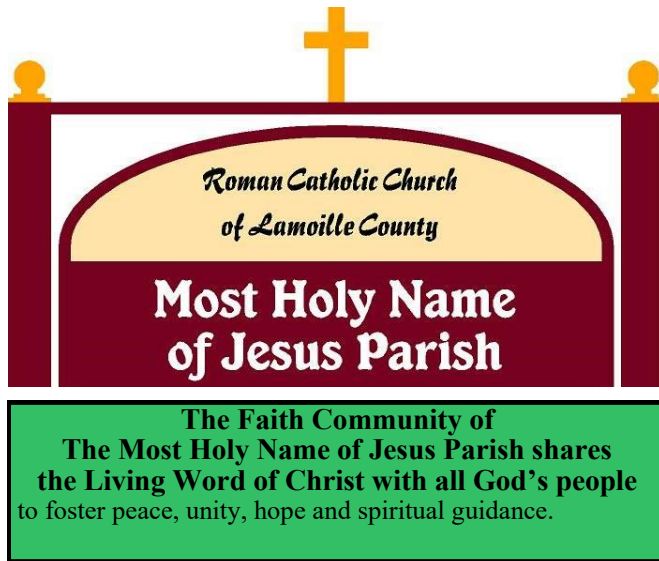

Dear Parishioners,

During this month of November, we remember to pray for all of the Holy Souls in Purgatory. But why? What is purgatory and why do those souls need our prayers?

The *Catechism* defines **purgatory** as a “purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven,” which is experienced by those “who die in God’s grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified” (CCC 1030). It notes that “this final purification of the elect is **entirely different** from the punishment of the damned” (CCC 1031). Purification is necessary because nothing unclean will enter the presence of God in heaven (Rev. 21:27) and, while one may die with their mortal sins forgiven, there may be disordered attachments or the effects of venial sins on our soul in need of purification (catholic.com).

St. Catherine of Genoa (1447-1510) was a married lay woman, but had a profound conversion to Christ after going to confession. The Lord graced her with a deep insight into purgatory as a state of inner purification of the soul. For souls in which purgatory is a necessity upon death, this state of cleansing is not resisted in a way a child resists punishment from his parents; but rather is something *desired*. She wrote, “The souls in Purgatory cannot, as I understand, choose but be there, and this is by God’s ordinance.” In fact, the soul sees this purification as an act of God’s burning love.


Upon death, the soul sees itself as it really is *and* sees it in contrast to what it was created to be. The latter - what the soul was created to be - St. Catherine of Genoa refers to as the “beatific instinct,” or soul’s capacity or desire to love God, and with each person this beatific instinct varies. For instance, even if I were to be perfect in what God created me to be, my beatific instinct or capacity to love God would never equal that of the Blessed Virgin Mary’s. As stars in the night sky have a different capacity to shine, souls are created with a different capacity to love God in heaven. In any case, the soul in purgatory sees – as if in an instant – their personal sins and how far away they are from what God created them to be.

Purgatory is not a state of lamenting sins, however. After seeing its sins and imperfections upon death, the soul no more considers them. From here on out, the object of the soul’s vision and orientation is the beauty and glory of God. (<https://www.catholicnewsagency.com/column/st-catherine-of-geoas-vision-of-purgatory-2349>)
