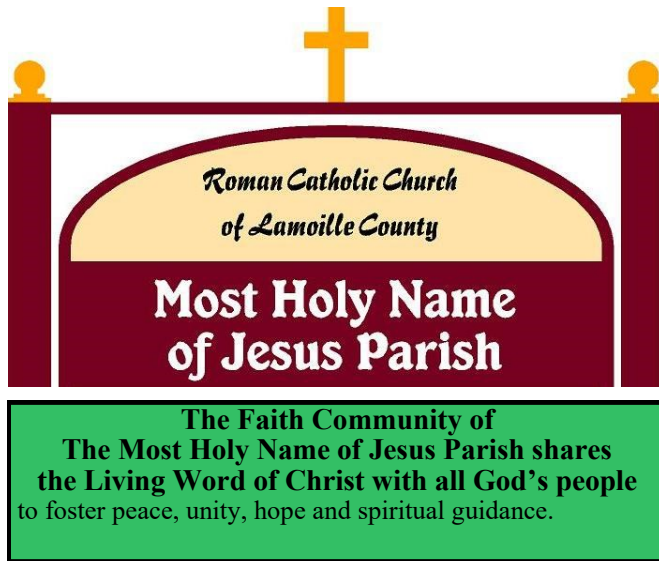

**Part 2 of 2 (Continued from last week)**  
*Dear Parishioners,*

At the moment of death, the soul in purgatory has so profound an encounter with God that it is simultaneously an occasion of immense happiness, but because it cannot yet possess fully what it tastes or what it partially beholds, it also suffers deeply. It's longing and ache for God consumes all other venial attachments and desires.

As the soul is purified it begins to radiate God's glory more and more, resembling little by little the splendor of the Trinity. The book of Wisdom provides this illustration of these justified souls: "As gold in a furnace, he proved them, and as sacrificial offerings, he took them to himself. In the time of their visitation they shall shine, and shall dart about as sparks through stubble." (3:6-7) St. Catherine of Genoa continues this thought by saying that day by day happiness increases in the soul as God flows into them. More and more, the rust of sin- the very thing which hinders them from fully possessing God - is burned away by divine love. Why do we pray for the souls in purgatory? Because they cannot pray for themselves. After death, a soul can no longer act for itself, but it is acted upon. Souls who have chosen to reject God's proposal to eternal love have chosen an eternal state called, "hell." Hell is the absence of love, and the consequence of those who reject God, who is love, is an eternal existence of torment.

In Purgatory, souls who have the effects of venial sin cannot act upon themselves, but depend on the Church, the mystical body of Christ, to intercede for them and so prepare them for eternal glory. This understanding is why we pray for and have Masses offered for our deceased loved ones, so that our prayers not only express our love and concern for them even after they have died, but can *actually* assist them home to God.

On another note, thank you to all who orchestrated and attended Fr. Joseph's birthday celebrations. He was moved by your warmth and congratulations, and we both recounted how blessed we are to serve in two wonderful parishes.

Each year, priests are required to make a retreat, and so this week I will be away from 11/18-23 in solitude. Retreat is always an important time to enter into God without interruptions or distractions, and to give that exclusive time to the Lord. I ask you to please lift me up in prayer this week. Thank you and have a blessed week!
