

Dear Parishioners,

A reminder to all parishioners that confessions are being held on FRIDAYS during Lent from 5-6pm at Most Holy Name (Stations to follow) and Blessed Sacrament (Stations begin at 4:30)

This fourth Sunday of Lent is called traditionally in the Church, *Laetare Sunday*. Each Sunday in Lent has its name derived from the Sunday's introit. T*Rejoice*, *Jerusalem*, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast. (Isaiah 66:10-11)

he first Sunday is called Invocabit; the second, Reminiscere; the third, Oculi; the fourth, Laetare; the fifth, Judica; the sixth, Palm Sunday. This fourth Sunday's name is taken from the Sunday's introit:

Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast. (Isaiah 66:10-11)

Talking about being joyful this time when coronavirus pandemic has changed the entire course of the history of the world will sound like a discordant note in a beautiful music. Why should someone be talking about joy when the whole world is in turmoil? When businesses, schools, places of worship, production industries, the social life and the beauty of our communities are closed down, why should someone be talking about joy? When virtually everything that make life beautiful have been taken away from us by coronavirus, is there anything left to be joyful for?

The book of Habakkuk 3:17-19 says, "Though the fig tree does not bud and there are no grapes on the vines, though the olive crop fails and the fields produce no food, though there are no sheep in the pen and no cattle in the stalls, yet I will rejoice in the LORD, I will be joyful in God my Saviour. The Sovereign LORD is my strength...." Having lost everything which we hold so dear in this trying moment, God is calling each of us to a deeper union with Him. Tough times as now are when true love are either strengthened or weakened. We may not see each other for a period of time because of this situation in the world that is plaguing our dear country; let us use this time to develop the family joy that will sustain us this period.

The Lord restored the sight of a man born blind; May we use this time to light our families with joy, bringing back family prayers and love for one another that we have lost to activism. May God protect you and your family from harm. Fr. Jon and I will be offering Masses and prayers for God's protection on you!

From the Desk of Bishop Christopher Coyne:

Effective Friday, March 20, all regularly scheduled public celebrations of the Catholic Mass, sacraments and devotions are suspended until further notice. Priests of the Diocese of Burlington will continue to celebrate Mass privately for the intentions of their community and the Church. Baptisms, funerals and weddings may take place but will be strictly limited in attendance to immediate family members.

I have taken this course of action following the advice of local public officials and the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) guidelines to limit gatherings to 10 people. While this is a difficult time for the faithful, we must all do our part to ensure the health and well-being of the larger community by helping prevent the spread of COVID-19. We will continue to monitor the situation and make changes as necessary.
