Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday, May 31st, concludes the Easter season with the celebration of the Descent of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost and is also the first time we can come back together for Mass publicly since March 19th. Jesus Himself longed to give the early Church the gift of the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, to empower them as His witnesses in the world. How great is the joy our hearts in returning to the celebration of the Eucharist as a community, as it is this very mystery that identifies us with Christ as His mystical body!

As we begin the slow reopening of our Churches for public worship, the Bishop has asked us to keep to the safety protocols. I realize that many of us have strong opinions on both sides of this issue, however charity demands that as a community of faith, we respect the guidelines when we come together in the Church. What will this mean? It will mean that we follow the directives from the Diocese and things will be a little different when we come back together. For example, there will be no distribution of the precious blood at Mass; there will be no altar servers or Extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist; lectors will come up to read from their place in the pews; every other pew will be taped off to maintain social distancing; masks are required for everyone entering the Church; we are not able to have choirs for Mass; coffee hour is suspended for the time being; and there will be a limited number of people (25% capacity) allowed in the Church for each Mass. Please keep in mind that these protocols are temporary and likely to change in the upcoming weeks.

As we get into the summer months ahead, Fr. Joseph and I look forward to seeing you and celebrating the sacraments with and for you. We have been praying each day for you and have been missing you. Please remember in your prayers those who died from the corona virus, and all who have lost loved ones during this time of pandemic, especially those who were not able to be close to their loved ones because of travel restrictions. May they rest in God's eternal peace.

**Tentative Guidelines from the Vermont
State Health Department and the Burlington
Diocese regarding opening of the parish for public
celebration of the Sacraments.**

- ◆ Attendance limited to 25% of seating capacity, or 35 people at any Mass at Most Holy Name.
- ◆ All parishioners must wear masks to be worn at Mass for the sake of other parishioners as well as the Priest.
- ◆ Enter church only at Brooklyn Street entrance.
- ◆ Use hand sanitizers before entering your pew. Supplies are limited here so please bring your own hand sanitizer if possible.
- ◆ Choir loft is closed for seating.
- ◆ The Crosby Center will not be open during Mass times.
- ◆ There will be no choirs or singing at Mass.
- ◆ All exits will be open at the end of Mass so as to maintain social distancing protocol.
- ◆ Instructions will be given at Mass for distribution of Holy Communion.
- ◆ There will be no gatherings for coffee hour following 8AM Mass on Sunday.
- ◆ There will be markings on the floor to maintain six feet between parishioners during Holy Communion distribution.
- ◆ Bishop Coyne has lifted the obligation to attend Sunday Mass UNTIL there is a vaccine.
- ◆ If you or any of your family are in any high risk category, we encourage you to consider staying home for yourself and others.
