*Dear Parishioners,*

This upcoming week we celebrate two saints that have profoundly shaped the Church and her life: St. Teresa of Jesus on Thursday and St. Margaret Mary Alacoque on Friday. Who are these saints, and why are they still so important to us today?

St. Teresa of Jesus (commonly known as St. Teresa of Avila) was a Spanish Carmelite nun who lived in the 16th century. Entering the convent against her father's wishes, she followed the voice of Jesus through a time of great political, social, and religious upheaval – a time much like our own. Like many religious orders of her day, the Carmelites had become lax in the discipline and practice of the faith. God sent Teresa with a mission to renew and reform the order...and that she did. Most of her efforts at reform were opposed, and she carried the burden of being misunderstood and misjudged, but God was her strength and joy.

Her entire life could be called, "A love affair with God," yet it was far from a bed of roses. Teresa was a mystic and entered ever more into the depths of spiritual life, realizing the painful purifications she must endure in order that she may be in perfect union with the God she loved.

St. Margaret Mary Alacoque lived in the 1800s, and came from a difficult home life marked by illness. After considering marriage, she entered a small convent in southern France of the Visitation Nuns at age 24. This Religious Order sought 'not be extraordinary except by being ordinary.'

Margaret Mary was known to be patient, kind, a bit clumsy, but humble and receptive even to harsh criticism. Three years into her vocation as a Visitation nun, Jesus began appearing to her and gave her a mission: to spread devotion to His Sacred heart, so that His love for humankind would be made known through her.

St. Margaret Mary was to make amends for all who turned away from God with her own love for Him by frequently loving and receiving Holy Communion, especially on the first Friday of the month. Many of her own sisters in the convent thought she was an imposter and ridiculed her severely. She was an unlikely choice to make this devotion to the Sacred Heart known to the Church and to the world...but such is our God!

May these two great saints and mystics of the Church inspire you to love Jesus more and be more generous with Him in your prayer. Have a blessed week!
