**Dear Parishioners,**

This past week, I stopped into a cemetery (which is rather appropriate for the month where the Church prays for all souls; in fact a plenary indulgence - applicable only to the souls in purgatory - is granted to the faithful who, on any and each day from November 1 to 8, devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, if only mentally, for the departed).

As peaceful as cemeteries are, especially blanketed by a fresh snowfall, it's impossible to not be confronted by mortality. There is an ancient Latin phrase so relevant to this month that is meant to stir the soul, humble us before the Almighty and deepen our reflection and prayer: *Memento Mori*...Remember your death! Have you ever seriously considered your own death? What it may be like when you pass from this world? What it will be like to come before Jesus, face to face? What earthly things you may be too attached to? What will be the easiest part of your life to let go of? What will be the most difficult? What fears do you have surrounding death? All of these questions, and others, are good for us to ponder because death frames and focuses how we live the time we are given.

Sacred art often depicts different saints with a skull beside them in the image, signaling the tie between knowing our own mortality and growing in holiness. How humbling to consider those grave words from the book of Genesis that begin our Lenten season each year, "For you are dust, and to dust you shall return" (Gen 3:19).

And herein lies the great hope of our salvation – Jesus Christ – who took our 'dust' to himself, and then after death, raised it up in glory. As we continue to pray for the dead throughout November, may we also consider our own death in light of Christ's death and hope in His Resurrection.

*Memento Mori*...Remember your death!
