Dear Parishioners,

Saturday, June 19, Bishop Coyne will ordain Deacon Robert Murphy to the priesthood and Gregory Caldwell to the transitional Diaconate for the Diocese of Burlington. I know these men quite well as they were in seminary formation during my time as Vocation Director. Robert and Greg have a great love for the church and sharing the gospel with the people of God - and they are a tremendous blessing to our Diocese. Please keep them in your prayers - pray that their lives of service to the Church may be fruitful and that through the intercession of our Blessed Mother Mary, they grow into good spiritual fathers that find fulfillment in serving God's people.

Recently in conversation, someone had mentioned the clergy shortage and the challenge facing our Diocese with the changing demographics. Their conclusion: we need more priests - to which I agreed. However, many point to the clergy shortage as the source of the problem and offer a solution like married clergy or women priests, neither of which offers a solution. Why? Because the clergy shortage is not the source of the problem...it's only a symptom.

Priests come from Catholic parents, families and parishes who love Christ and His Church and seek to live out and pass on the beauty and truth of the faith. In conversation with folks who offer women priests or married clergy as a solution, I've found that they actually do not understand the Priesthood as revealed by Christ and taught by His Church, nor have a proper metaphysical or sacramental world view, but rather are seeking a 'quick and easy' solution to a much deeper problem by proposing to change something God instituted. St. John Paul II definitively closed the door on the possibility of women priests to protect the deposit of faith handed on from Jesus himself. And there are different Catholic Rites where clergy are allowed to be married (in the Maronite, Ukrainian Catholic or Byzantine Catholic Rites, a man can be married before being ordained a priest, but not afterwards), and although it's been this way for centuries, they haven't seen a vocation explosion because they allow married clergy.

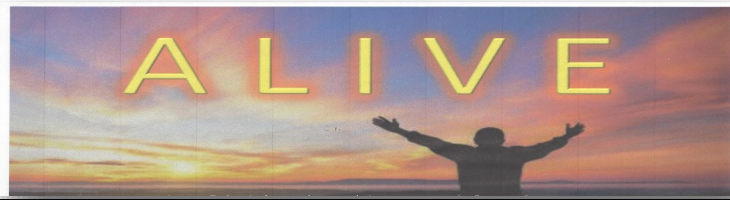
The true crisis, of which the clergy shortage is a symptom, is a culture that is moving farther and farther away from God and Godly values and affecting the basic building blocks of life, marriage, family, and society that God created. So in returning to our two men to be ordained this Saturday - pray for them and their families!
