Dear parishioners,

Last Sunday, about 20 parishioners from both parishes gathered to consecrate themselves to Jesus through Mary – a powerful devotion begun by St. Louis de Montfort and re-invigorated recently by Pope St. John Paul II. Why does this woman have so much to do with you? Mary has everything to do with you because without her ‘yes’ to God’s proposal, the Word doesn’t become flesh and humanity is stuck in its fallen state with no hope of salvation. Mary’s ‘yes’ allowed God to enter his creation – remember that God is respectful of our freedom. He doesn’t impose himself on us or on creation, but waits to be welcomed...and that’s what Mary did. She allowed the invisible God to take flesh from her in her womb and become visible, and thus something He was not – a human being, like us in every way except sin.

Devotion to Mary is biblical (Jn 19:27), part of the living tradition of the Church, and is strongly encouraged by the teaching of the Church and the saints. Why? No Mary, No Jesus. Know Mary, Know Jesus. Jesus is a human being, but not a human person; He is a divine person (because personhood has to do with origin) who through the womb of the Virgin Mary, became a human being. If God did not choose to reveal himself and come to us concretely through Mary, he would have remained an abstraction. But, as Karl Rahner observed, abstractions do not need a mother. “Mary is the means our Lord chose to come to us...she is also the means we should choose to go to Him” (Montfort).

At a funeral recently, I was reflecting on the reality of our bodies – and how everything, literally EVERYTHING in our faith depends on the body. Our bodies matter – they matter tremendously. Check out this from the Catechism of the Catholic Church 1015: “The flesh is the hinge of salvation.” We believe in God who is creator of the flesh; we believe in the Word made flesh in order to redeem the flesh; we believe in the resurrection of the flesh, the fulfillment of both the creation and the redemption of the flesh.”

Flesh, flesh, flesh, flesh, flesh! Heaven promises to be a bodily experience, ordered by grace, but bodily. This is why our devotion to Mary and her love for Jesus is so important – it grounds us in the fleshly reality of being human. Without her, Christ becomes an abstraction, as does the Church, as does the Eucharist and the other sacraments, and we are misled to believe that we are spirits or souls, but not our bodies! Thank God for your body this week – for it is through your body that Salvation has come to you! Have a blessed week!

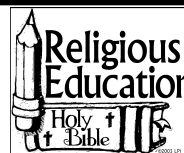
