Dear parishioners,

With As we continue to learn some of the basic principles of discernment of God’s will, bequeathed to the Church by St. Ignatius of Loyola, lets remember that when it comes to personal decisions involving our lives, the most important “text” is our hearts, and the book/text/rules of Ignatius is like a flashlight shining upon our hearts to give us the vocabulary to understand and articulate what is going on within.

“God calls man first. Man may forget his Creator or hide far from his face; he may run after idols or accuse God of having abandoned him; yet the living and true God tirelessly calls each person to that mysterious encounter known as prayer. In prayer, God’s initiative of love always comes first; our own first step is always a response” (CCC 2567).

John 15:9 states, “As the Father loves me, so I love you. Remain in my love.” The goal of prayer is remaining united with God. Our root desire is union with God who is life and who is the ultimate fulfillment of every human desire. God labors for us to be in communion with Him; throughout the day to stay with Him, and this is the discipline of daily prayer: stopping in the motion of our day to remain in His love.

Sifting through the daily movements of our soul opens our eyes to God’s daily self-revelation and clarifies our responses to it. This way of praying allows us to see God in the often missed details of our daily lives – your favorite song on the radio; an email from an old friend; your favorite weather! How encouraging the Catechism is for reminding us about authentic prayer: “if our hearts are far from God then our words are in vain.”

So one practical tip for this week – avoid incessant motion. Incessant motion exteriorly can be our way of hiding from our own inner darkness; we stay outside ourselves and never enter into our hearts. Daily prayer, the discipline of stopping and just being present to God is the way of being regularly available to that divine light and love that can heal our darkness and point the way towards spiritual growth.

Next week we’ll consider how it is that God beholds us. Keep praying – and may you have a blessed week!

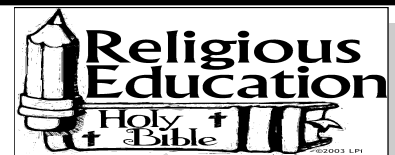
