**Dear parishioners,**  
Continuing on our topic of prayer and discernment, we consider this week how to begin our time of prayer. This foundational step is crucial for entering into true prayer, one that involves the whole of our being. Much like learning a new sport or how to play a musical instrument, learning this fundamental step and practicing it daily give us the spiritual muscle memory to become good pray-ers. St. Ignatius instructs us to begin prayer always in the relationship of love with God. Consider the story of the rich young man from Mark's Gospel:

As he was setting out on a journey, a man ran up, knelt down before him, and asked him, "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus answered him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: 'You shall not kill; you shall not commit adultery; you shall not steal; you shall not bear false witness; you shall not defraud; honor your father and your mother.'" He replied and said to him, "Teacher, all of these I have observed from my youth." Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said to him, "You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to [the] poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." At that statement his face fell, and he went away sad, for he had many possessions.

Jesus looked at the young man and loved him – his love was known by his look, it was revealed in his eyes. We are meant to begin our time of prayer considering the love with which God looks upon us. This first step is to know that God is there, and He is beholding us with love and attentiveness. In Isaiah 43 we read, "You are precious in God's eyes." But do we believe that?

So often when we go to prayer, we project onto God how we are feeling at the time. God did not have a bad day at work; God is not feeling far from us; God is not upset at a comment that someone made. We need to shed this before entering into prayer. St. Ignatius recommends trying for about a minute or so to sit in quiet and to consider the love with which God looks upon us, a love based on who we are, not what we've done or haven't done, and then from there, we move in prayer towards gratitude... which we'll discuss next week.

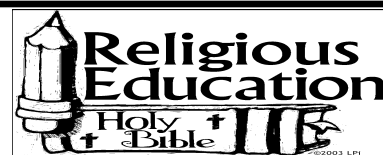
