**Dear parishioners,**  
This week's Gospel from St. Mark is a tough one! Jesus is giving authoritative teaching on marriage that is meant to bring light and clarity even to our time where much confusion exists surrounding the topic of marriage, divorce, and Church teaching. My intention in sharing this information over the next few weeks is the same – to bring clarity, light and understanding. What is marriage in the Catholic Church and how is it different than a civil marriage? A civil marriage is a legal contract formed by two people that can be dissolved by the authority of the state. The Sacrament of Matrimony in Catholicism is a covenant, a sacred vow that, like God's promise of love to us, can never be broken. Only death can dissolve the covenantal bond between husband and wife. Therefore, man and woman freely enter this covenant and are called to reveal the free, total, faithful, fruitful love that Jesus Christ has for us. The Sacramentally married couple vows to become a living sign or image of that love, if you will, whereas the civilly married couple is not bound by that standard. Therefore, one main difference between a Civil and Sacramental marriage is the authority that recognizes that union. In today's Gospel, Jesus insists on the Father's original design for marriage and refers the Pharisees back to Genesis, "...from the beginning of creation, God made them male and female...and the two shall become one flesh. Therefore, what God has joined together, no human being must separate." Over the next several weeks, I will share the Church's teaching through this column in response to some of the many questions I've been asked about different situations about marriage like: divorce, remarriage, reception of communion, annulments, convalidation, etc. My hope is to inform my parishioners about Christ's teaching from the Gospel today and further the understanding and distinctions regarding marriage in the Catholic Church. In realizing this is a delicate topic for some who will read these columns, please know that Fr. Paul and I are always available to you. God bless and have a great week! *With Mary, In Christ, Fr. 
