Dear parishioners,

Continuing from last week's theme on marriage in the Catholic Church, I'm sharing some frequently asked questions that I've received as a priest that I hope will inform your understanding on the Church's teaching concerning marriage.

Is a baptized Catholic obligated to be married according to the norms of the Church? Short answer: Yes. Why? Because by baptism, our lives are ordered towards God and his family, the Church, meaning that a baptized person belongs to God, and therefore offers the gift of their love for their fiancé to God so it can become a Sacrament that pours God's grace not only into their lives, but through their Sacramental love, God's grace pours into the whole Church and becomes a supernatural blessing for all of us.

What if a baptized Catholic gets married outside the Church's norms for marriage? Because of baptism, the person is still oriented towards God but because of the marriage in this case, being civil instead of sacramental in nature, they are in what is called and 'irregular situation.' Being in an irregular marriage situation means that a person can participate in Mass, but not receive the sacraments until they are in a 'regular' situation. The best thing for one to do is to speak with their priest who will work together with the couple towards con-validating the union, or having the marriage 'blessed.'

What is does it mean to have the Church 'bless' your marriage? Simply, it is working together with a priest or deacon to bring a civil marriage of a baptized Catholic(s) into accordance with the Church's norms for the marriage to be a Sacrament. Usually the preparation involves a meeting or two with a priest, a little bit of paperwork, and an exchange of vows from the Rite of Matrimony.

Can a baptized Catholic get married to a non-Catholic, or even a non-baptized person, in the Church? Short answer: Yes. Why? The priest preparing them for marriage can ask the Bishop for a dispensation for the benefit of the Catholic party, and there is a promise made by the Catholic party to pass along the faith to the children. 
