Dear parishioners,

This week I'll be finishing the series on the Christ's teaching on sacramental marriage and annulments. As mentioned previously, for a sacrament to take place, it has to be celebrated in the right way (according to the prescribed ritual) and the right stuff has to be present. For example, in the sacrament of reconciliation a person cannot receive the grace of God's forgiveness if they are not sorry for their sins. Contrition is the 'stuff' that must be present for the sacrament of reconciliation to actually have an effect in the penitent's soul. So, what's the right stuff for the sacrament of marriage?

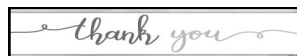
First you need a baptized man and a baptized woman, who as they exchange their vows, have the intention to love to each other (1) freely, (2) totally, (3) faithfully, and (4) fruitfully. What do these 4 intentions mean? The intention to love freely means that someone isn't being pressured or coerced into marriage, but that they are of their own free will choosing to marry. The intention to love totally refers to a total gift of oneself to the other, the willingness to give everything and hold nothing back. "The two become one" refers to the total union of both persons, which is why pre-nuptial agreements are against the intention of totality within sacrament of marriage because they place a condition on the spousal bond. The intention for fidelity means that this couple is intending an exclusive spousal love with each other – their 'yes' to love each other in this sacred bond is a 'no' to love any other man and woman on the planet in this way. What if there is infidelity 25 years after the marriage? That would be moral lapse, certainly a mortal sin, but does not necessarily invalidate the moment when the vows were exchanged and the intention was present. If infidelity was present during engagement and shortly after the wedding, evidence would likely show that there was an intention against fidelity. The intention for fruitfulness is that the union is open to the natural goods of the conjugal act, namely unity of the spouses and the procreation of children. An intention against life invalidates the sacrament because it is a direct intention against the design of God for marriage, the conjugal act, and the commandment, "Be fruitful and multiply." Children are always a gift and blessing from God – without exception.

For a person applying for an annulment, an in-depth application is filled out and an investigation is made into the time that the vows were exchanged to see if something was lacking or an obstacle to the sacrament actually taking place was present. It may have looked or seemed like a marriage, but it couldn't have been a sacramental marriage because something was missing.

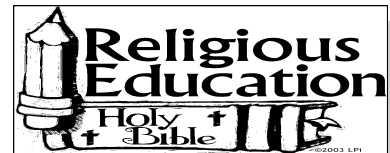
