Dear Friends,

Are you starting to go stir crazy? Have you cleaned and organized and then cleaned and organized again? Today as I was walking, a woman approaching me on the sidewalk stopped and put on a mask before we got too close -- roughly 10 feet apart!!!! When I enter the grocery store, I'm very aware of what I touch. Not only for other's germs but spreading my own. If I touch something, I had better buy it!!! Wow! A bit nutty out there! How does one keep it together? Prayer!

Each day I give myself three times to walk and pray. What am I praying, you ask? A Rosary, Divine Mercy Chaplet, and for people. I pray for lots of people. Most often I turn to the Blessed Mother to care for them (a Hail Mary). Some more needy ones receive a call out to the Father (an Our Father). Basically, there are 6 different categories of needy people for whom I pray and at the end of each category I say: "for all those who have asked me to pray for them, those I forgot to pray for, those I have ignored in prayer, and those who need my prayer." Then I again call out to the Father.

Prayer helps everything make sense. It calms me and quiets my soul, connects me to my God, the Heavenly Host and my fellow humans here and here after! I have a particular attraction to calling out to the dead. The space between the living and the dead is not that far. I often thank the dead for praying for me, and helping me serve God and his people with their intercession. So, let us get to praying. God knows we need to!!
