"Passing the Basket" by Pete Nero

Around 15 years ago my wife, Judith, and I traveled with one of our daughters and her husband to downtown Manhattan for a weekend visit. Saturday was spent seeing a show and on Sunday morning we all attended St. Patrick's for Mass. We got there fairly early and had our pick of almost any pew we wanted. As we settled in, and as I knelt to say a prayer, I felt a tap on my shoulder and turned to find a very large man standing behind me dressed in a suit with a serious look on his face. He said, "We need you to help with the collection and you will be doing rows 50 to 80". He turned around and left for the back of the church. For some reason in all my Catholic life I had never been asked to pass the basket - and now, Lord, you want me to do it in St. Patrick's Cathedral? In New York City? How wonderful it would be to sit back, pray, enjoy the beautiful church and think happy thoughts, but now all I could think about was: "When do I get up to go to the back of the church? Would someone be there to help me and point me in the right direction? Why wasn't I dressed better?" and "Oh yeah, how was I supposed to know where rows 50-80 were?" I quickly looked to see what row we were in. I think it was 60 something, so that was good. At least I was in the ballpark. How I needed to pray "Jesus, I trust in you", but no, it was all about me and how I might get embarrassed. I left for the back right after the homily, not wanting to take any chances. As I walked back, I was looking down at pew numbers and hoping not to walk into something or someone. I reached the back, and was handed the basket. Walking slowly forward, somehow (thank you Jesus), I found the row I was looking for - number 50! Ending with row 80 was easy! I made haste to get to the back of the church again, hand over the basket and get back to my seat. As I pivoted, and took a couple of steps, happy I got through it, I heard the big man say: "Hey, there's a second collection!" It was a little easier the second time around. I still need to work on trust and believe and know that He has every single daily event in my life, big and small, in His tender care.
