The Year of St. Joseph:

Pope Francis has declared a Year of St. Joseph (December 8, 2020 to December 8, 2021) to celebrate the 150th anniversary of the proclamation of Saint Joseph as Patron of the universal Church. In recognition of this, St. Anthony's Church has provided a space to display St. Joseph statuary and iconography. If you have a St. Joseph statue or picture that could be shared with the Church, the table is to the left of the Lectionary, by the statue of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.
