Catholic Leadership Institute Update

Earlier this year, along with parishes throughout the diocese, St. Patrick and St. Anthony-St. George participated in a survey conducted under the guidance of Catholic Leadership Institute. Seventynine completed surveys were returned.

A committee, formed by Father Bill, has met several times during the summer and is committed to communicating its work to our parishioners on a regular basic. We would like to begin by highlighting what we see as the greatest strengths of our parishes that emerged from the survey data.

The survey data show that our parishioners overwhelmingly see our parishes as welcoming and inviting communities. We were excited to learn that many regularly take the initiative to invite others to Mass or parish functions. This is evidence that those who responded see the Church as fundamental to their relationship with God and that they have a desire to share that relationship with others.

Survey results show that belief in scripture, as the Word of God, is central to the faith of our parishioners and manifests itself in a deep prayer life among us. We can build on these strengths to create a community even more linked through prayer and the Word of God.

We were impressed to find that many have sought retreats and catechetical experiences outside our parish. This desire to learn about and deepen our faith should be the goal of every faith community.

These strengths are the result of the fact that respondents see the Church as critical in their relationship with God. This shows itself in steady Mass attendance especially among families with young children, and this commitment to the Mass is the beginning and summit of all that we do as the people of God.

All this gives us hope that our parishes can achieve any goals we set for ourselves. We would be happy to discuss the results of the survey with anyone who is interested. Please contact one of us, if you have any questions about the survey results.

In the near future, we look forward to sharing with you some goals and priorities we recommend based on the survey results. Please pray for our parishes and the success of this process as we move forward.
