Unfinished Business:

I am currently working on the Past grand Knight Appreciation Event. I am coordinating this even with Tim McCool of 3rd Planet Brewery and his manager of the original location John Emsing. The location of the original 3rd Planet Brewery known as the Launchpad is 120 Partin Drive in Niceville. The event is planned for the 3rd week of August. Exact date of this event will be determined soon. The event will be from 6:00 pm to 9:00 pm. It will include a beer tasting of several of their craft beers followed by an opportunity for each guest to choose a pint of beer from the beers sampled. Additional beer may be purchased by the pint, half growler or full growler. New Business:

As most of you already know the Focus for my term as Grand Knight is back to basics, the foundation of Knighthood. Who we are and why we are here. Since I have been a Knight for just over 2 years and as part of my Quest (and I used the word Quest because Knights always seem to be on a Quest) I have been reading literature on this topic. I have read "Parish Priest" by Douglas Brinkley which is a biography of Father Michael J. McGivney. I am now reading a book recommended to me by District Deputy John Rafferty called, "Faith and Fraternity" by Christopher J. Kauffman which is a history of the Knights of Columbus from 1882-1982, the first 100 years. I ordered it on e-bay and got it used in excellent condition

for only about \$7.00. Since it is 500 pages long and has some really, nice photographs in it I thought that was a well worth the money. I also have found information in Columbia magazine. In the April 2018 issue there was an article called “Knighthood and the ‘New Man’”. It can also be found in the archives at the Columbia magazine website. In this article there were the “22 Rules of Knighthood”. These rules were written more than 500 years ago by Erasmus of Rotterdam in his book “The Manual of a Christian Knight”. I have made copies of these 22 rules. Deputy Grand Knight would you assist me by passing these out. There are 22 rules listed. If you would put this copy somewhere you would see it almost every day, bathroom mirror, front of the refrigerator, by the coffee pot or on your desk at home or at work. Go through these rules one by one for the next 12 months and think about them during the day. Ask yourself is this something I already do? Do I do it well? Could I improve upon it? Am I satisfied with my life in this area etc? After a little soul searching and any needed modification to our lives if needed we can develop new habits or discontinue old ones making ourselves better Knights.

Another practice I would like to start is for the council Officers, and that is wear of name badges by Officers at Mass with all attire. Non-officers can wear their Knights of Columbus lapel pin. The reason for wearing the Officers badges by Officers as opposed to the lapel pin is the lapel pins are small and not as easily visible or readily identifiable as to what they are to non-members unless you are standing right in front of the person wearing it and talking to them. Name badges also have names and Officer positions. I think this will make more men in the parish who are not Knights realize how many Knights of all ages we have in our parish. This would also be a good, conversation starter if they have questions regarding the Knights. I believe this will attract some men in our parish to join our council. And if they have questions they will know who to ask.

I urge you to carry a Form 100 to Mass. Form 100s are located in the Knight’s box in the church library if you ever need one. I carry one in my Daily Missal so I will have one if needed. If you are ever at the same service as I am and you need one just let me know. I should have at least one with me. Since I have been a Knight we have membership drives periodically which are great but I have also seen that a large number of Knights who join our council do not hear about us at membership drives or ministry fairs but after a Mass from a Knight. I know that I joined the Knights because I was approached after Mass several times by Moe Powers. I told him I wanted to think, pray and discuss it with my wife before I decided to join. Moe continued to ask me periodically if I had any questions or if I was ready to join and after several times I made the commitment and joined. (And look where that got me). If someone tells you they want to think about it periodically ask them if they have thought about it, have any questions or have decided to join. I also think that if we do this more regularly we will have less need for membership drives and last, minute pushes to continue to achieve Star Council.

Another way to approach a potential future Knights is contact information cards for that purpose which also should be carried to Mass with a pen that you don’t mind if you do not get back. I believe Brother Tim Pugh or Steve Zajac has these cards available or knows where we could get them.

The Niceville Life Runners will be having their run/walk to support the Pro-Life cause for the month of July on 14 July, this Saturday at 8:00 am at Turkey Creek nature trail. All are encouraged to attend and the run/walk can be done at your own pace for a distance decided upon by you. Pictures are taken and posted on the Facebook page and group prayers are said for the unborn before the run/walk begins.

Remember all activity types like youth, church, recruiting drives, community, and council. Soccer challenge should be done in September, Spelling Bee October, Basketball November.

FAMILY OF THE MONTH

June 2018

Gil and Diane Meisner

Although Brother Gil only just attained his First Degree in January 2018, both he and his wife Diane are very active in leading or supporting various parish ministries as well as supporting the pastor in many other church projects. He is ready to answer the call of the Grand Knight when volunteers for any activity called for. Brother Gil is a mainstay in our numerous Council operations in helping the project leaders of various activities in completing a number of substantial efforts by supporting our Catholic and local communities. This includes normal council meetings, membership drives, KoC degree ceremonies, and social events such as activities in the Family Life Center. He and Diane actively participate in the monthly Pasta Dinner program on one of the Teams by setting up the Center, preparing and then serving the pasta dinners in the effort to fund raise for charitable church activities. The dinners collect hundreds of dollars for pro-life charity programs supported by the Knights, while also providing members of the parish with an excellent dinner on Saturday nights at a very reasonable cost. Typically 80 -100 people show up for the monthly dinners. Brother Gil can always be found supporting the Council Bingo Team One as a floor worker on those weekends when his team has that duty. Diane supports the team by working in the kitchen and preparing various types of foods to feed the players. He and the other members of the four Bingo teams have been instrumental in the activity's success in producing over 70% of the income used in charitable, community, and council support. This equates to over \$30,000 per year and it provides the bulk of the funding needed to support the Council's budget. This contribution of time and talent for just the bingo activity alone exceeds 60 man-hours per year. Brother Gil has also helped with other Council programs to support Handicapped Citizens. He and the other volunteers work the entrances at a key store in the Niceville area and collect contributions while handing out vast quantities of donated Tootsie Rolls to the contributors in support of the Handicapped Citizens Drive. Typically over \$2400 is collected each year for this charitable activity. This year Brother Gil and Diane supported the semi-annual Rummage Sale which provides for additional funding to sustain the Parish Family Life Center activities. He worked for eight full days during the weeklong event collecting large pieces of furniture from contributing households in the Parish, cataloging the pieces, assisted in setting up the booths in the Life Center, helped to load items to people's vehicles, and then cleaning up the Center after the event. During the Parish Family picnic this past Spring, Brother Gil, Diane, and 30+ other knights and their wives spent over six hours setting up the Family Parish Center, cooking the food, serving the food, and then performing clean-up. The KoC members grilled over 800 hamburgers and hot dogs to serve over 500 parish members. Almost the entire parish attended this special event and it culminated as a complete success. Recently, Brother Gil assisted a fellow Brother in need to completely relocate his restaurant in less than a week. Gil and other knights moved heavy items such as furniture, ovens, refrigerators and the dozens of other objects that can be found in any restaurant. The restaurant was up and running again within one day of the massive move. Brother Gil supports the community as a full time bus driver for the Liza Jackson Charter School in Fort Walton Beach. He also works in the kitchen of the school cafeteria. So essentially, he gets the students to the school from all over the city, works to feed them at lunch, and then makes sure they get home safely every school day. Diane is an active member of the Parish Ladies Sodality. As an active member of the distinguished group of women in the Sodality, she helped to work unselfishly with the set up and execution of social functions such as Cakewalks, picnics, and other Parish events. The group also hosts receptions at Funerals and memorial services while aiding the grieving friends and relatives of those whom have passed on. She is also actively involved as a volunteer in the daily operation of the Group's thrift shop called Angel Attic. Every day the Ladies open up and sell numerous items, mostly donated by Parish members. The funding is used to provide charity to Catholic organizations. She also volunteers as a worker and helper in a local senior living center called the Pavilion. They assist in a number of ways to help the residents with everyday activities, celebrate birthdays of the seniors, and essentially provide a friendly social setting with people who appreciate their time. Brother Gil and Diane embody and exercise those Christian traits so necessary in today's Catholic Church and the Knights of Columbus in so many varied projects and events, and all these activities have been accomplished in the past six months as a new knight.
