Hurtubise Family Ancestry

Monday, July 26, Descendants of Helen Deslauriers (1851–1931) and Moses Thebodeau (1848–1908) will be acknowledging the passing of 90 years since Helen's death July 13, 1931, at her gravesite in All Saints Cemetery. Helen and Moses were some of the earliest parishioners of All Saints.

Helen's death during the Great Depression likely kept her children from having her name added to the family gravestone. Earlier this month, descendant family members (great grandchildren) had her name added and the gravestone cleaned and repaired. Helen and Moses had 9 children (6 sons and 3 daughters), 31 grandchildren and 99 known great grandchildren.

Family names for Helen and Moses children include: Thebodeau, Brown, Broe (Breault), and Rainey. The family hopes this effort will help those seeking knowledge of their family ancestry and their Richford history. *Donlon Hurtubise*

July 22nd: Feast of St. Mary Magdalene



A*FTER the glorious Resurrection of Jesus Christ, the triumph of His Ascension, and the coming of the Holy Spirit, the word of God was spread far and wide, and the number of the faithful grew day by day. But the Priests of the Jews, the Pharisees and Scribes, kindled the fire of persecution, and chased most of Jesus' witnesses out of Judea. During the terrible persecutions, the disciples traveled to different places of the world to announce the Good News.*

One of the 70 disciples was Maximin, known for his perfection in moral integrity, illustrious through his doctrine, and honored for the gift he had been granted to perform miracles. In the same manner as the Blessed Mother was placed in the care of John, so Mary Magdalene was placed in the care of Maximin, attentive to his religious guidance.

This is how, during the dispersion, Mary Magdalene left all her possessions and traveled to the sea, where in the company of Maximin, she boarded a vessel and safely arrived near the port of Marseille [France]. There, inspired by the Lord, they made their way to the town of Aix, and by their fasting, prayers, and through the spreading of the divine message, they attracted people to the cult of God. Maximin governed the Church of Aix for numerous years, preaching the Word of God, chasing demons, anointing the dying, curing the blind and the crippled, and healing all manner of sickness.

Mary Magdalene retired to the cliffs not far from the city. There for thirty years she devoted herself to solitary penance for the sins of her past life, which she had never ceased to bewail bitterly. During this long seclusion, she was never seen or heard of, and it was supposed that she was dead.

Mary fasted so rigorously, that but for the occasional visits of the angels, and the comfort bestowed by celestial visions, she might have perished. When the time came for Mary Magdalene to be freed of her earthly body, she saw Christ Who came to call her to the glory of the heavenly Kingdom. He came to give the substance of eternal life to the one who had so faithfully given of her substance when He walked the earth.

She died on the eleventh day before the Kalends of August, namely on July 22, amidst great rejoicing of the angels in heaven. Maximin embalmed her most holy body with many aromatic herbs, and placed it in an honorable tomb, over which he elevated a most beautiful church. There can be seen her white marble sarcophagus with sculptures that represent her story as to how she came to find the Lord at the house of Simon, and so obtained forgiveness of her sins, and the devout duties she carried out for the Savior's entombment.
